India summons Russia envoy over killing of 4 sailors: 'Grave concern'

MEA: Targeting of commercial shipping unacceptable

INDIA ON Tuesday summoned the Russian Charge d'Affaires (CDA) and conveyed "unequivocal condemnation" and "grave concern" over the deaths of four Indian seafarers in a Russian missile strike on a merchant vessel off the coast of Ukraine.

"Today, the Russian Chargé d'Affaires, Mr Vladimir Ladanov, was summoned to the Ministry of External Affairs. The Ministry conveyed India's grave concerns and unequivocal condemnation of the attack on the commercial vessel *MV Golden Leo* on 19 July 2026, which resulted in the tragic loss of four Indian lives, emphasising that such attacks undermine the safety, security and stability of international maritime commerce," the MEA said in a statement.

"The Russian Chargé d'Affaires was requested to convey India's strong concerns to his authorities that the targeting of commercial shipping and the resulting loss of innocent civilian lives are unacceptable and must be avoided," it said.

While India was quick to condemn the attack on Monday, it did not name Russia. The naming, and summoning, of a Russian diplomat on Tuesday is significant, considering Delhi is perceived to be closer to Moscow and has done the diplo-

matic tightrope walk over the last four years of the Russia-Ukraine war.

While there have been deaths of Indian seafarers in the US-Iran war in West Asia in the last four-and-a-half months, this is the first time that Indian sailors have died in the Russia-Ukraine war.

According to the Ukrainian Air Force, Russian forces launched three Kh-59/Kh-69 cruise missiles, one of which struck the starboard side of the *Golden Leo* — a Turkish-owned merchant vessel sailing under the flag of Guinea-Bissau — while it was departing Ukraine's southern port of Odesa on Sunday.

The strike killed 10 people, including four Indians. The MEA had said another Indian sailor was "hospitalised in a critical condition".

While the Centre is yet to release the names of the dead, two sailors have been identified by their families as Akhil Joyan, 26, a resident of Kasaragod district in Kerala, and Abhishek Nishad, 22, a resident of Deoria district in Uttar Pradesh. Their families have said they were contacted by the shipping firm.

The attack came amid a sharp escalation in Russian strikes on Ukraine's maritime infrastructure. According to the Ukrainian Sea Ports Authority (USPA), Russian forces attacked 23 port infrastructure facilities and 17 civilian vessels during the first two weeks of July alone, killing 11 people.

The repeated attacks have disrupted grain exports, with some ship owners reportedly refusing to send vessels to Ukraine's Black Sea ports because of the growing security risks.

2 brothers drown while trying to rescue each other in Sriganganagar

TWO BROTHERS drowned in an artificial pond while trying to rescue each other in Sri Ganganagar district on Tuesday, police said.

The incident took place in 56 NP village under Raisinagar area in the morning when the duo was working in a farm, they said.

According to the police, Rajdeep Singh, 20, accidentally slipped and fell into a water pond while fixing a pipe in the field. His elder brother, Gurjit Singh, 24, immediately jumped in to save him, but both drowned in deep water.

On receiving information, local villagers and farmers rushed to the spot and launched a rescue operation, but could not save them.

"Despite efforts by villagers, both brothers died on the spot," the police said.

Man killed over land dispute in Bharatpur

Meanwhile, a retired assistant sub-inspector and his family members allegedly beat a 30-year-old man to death over a land dispute in Bharatpur district, police said on Tuesday.

The incident took place on Monday in Tuhia village under Udyog Nagar police station limits. The accused are absconding, the police said.

Station House Officer Rakesh Kasana said a case of murder has been registered based on a complaint filed by Nakul Singh, uncle of the deceased Sushil Kumar.

According to the FIR, Sushil, a farmer, owned land worth crores along a highway. His parents had died earlier.

"The accused, a neighbour-

ing retired ASI, wanted to possess the land and was mounting pressure on Sushil to transfer it in his name," Kasana said.

He said that around 4 pm on Monday, the accused Gajendra Singh and his family members allegedly reached Sushil's house, took him to their home and forced him to hand over the land.

"When Sushil refused, they attacked him with sticks and iron rods, leaving him seriously injured," the officer said.

Police said the accused later took Sushil to RBM Hospital in Bharatpur, where doctors declared him dead.

After HC direction on wife's petition, Sonam Wangchuk shifted to Medanta Hospital

ACTIVIST SONAM Wangchuk, who is on his 24th day of hunger strike, was discharged from the Safdarjung Hospital on Tuesday evening and shifted to Medanta Hospital in Gurgaon for further treatment in compliance with a Delhi High Court order.

Wangchuk was brought to the Medanta Hospital in an ambulance at 7.28 pm under tight security. He has been admitted to ICU 8 and his treatment has begun under the supervision of Dr Shushila Kataria, an internal medicine specialist, said a hospital official.

The HC earlier in the day directed that Wangchuk be shifted to a hospital of his choice.

The bench of Chief Justice D K Upadhyaya and Justice Tejas Karia allowed his wife Gitanjali Angmo round-the-clock access to Wangchuk at Medanta Hospital. It also directed that Wangchuk be constantly monitored and that medicines be administered as required in the opinion of the hospital's experts, and that Wangchuk shall abide by the advice.

Wangchuk, who has been on hunger strike since June 28,

demanding Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan's resignation over NEET paper leaks, was hospitalised at Safdarjung Hospital after Delhi Police swooped in at the protest site in Jantar Mantar on July 18 and moved him to the hospital, citing his health condition.

The court, directing for the shift — as was desired by Wangchuk — opined that he "ought to be shifted to a hospital of his choice" and that it "will be in fulfilment of requirements of his fundamental rights" to life, free movement and personal liberty.

The order comes after HC took note of claims of violation of his fundamental rights — including excessive police

searches on him and seized electronic devices — as alleged by Wangchuk in a letter.

Angmo, in her initial petition on July 19, had said that Wangchuk's "continued confinement" at Safdarjung Hospital is "wholly without the authority of law," with no FIR, order of arrest, preventive detention order or any other judicial or executive order authorising "his continued confinement, isolation or denial of access to his legal counsel or doctors who had been examining him for the last 20 days".

"Such deprivation of personal liberty, deforms any procedure established by law, is ex facie violative of Article 21 of the Constitution, and every pas-

Gehlot slams Centre over refusal to engage with protesting students; Pradhan should resign: Pilot

FORMER RAJASTHAN chief minister Ashok Gehlot on Tuesday lashed out at the Centre, alleging that its refusal to engage with protesting students reflected its failure, and said it was unfortunate that Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and several MPs had to stage a dharna near the Prime Minister's residence over the paper leak issue.

On the other hand, senior Congress leader Sachin Pilot demanded the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan over alleged examination paper leaks, backing the protest near the prime minister's residence.

"Dharmendra Pradhan should resign," Pilot wrote in a post on X.

Addressing a press conference in Jaipur, Gehlot said, "The government failed to initiate any dialogue with students despite several days of protests over examination paper leaks. No representative of the government went to meet the agitating students or ask them what they want." The former chief minister said it was unprecedented that the Lok Sabha leader of opposition, the Congress president and several MPs had to sit on a dharna near the PM's residence. "What message is this sending across the country and the world?" he asked, alleging the government's conduct has exposed its tall claims.

The senior Congress leader claimed the anger among the youth over repeated paper leaks, unemployment and inflation was far greater than what the government can assess.

"If the government has faith in democracy, it must listen to the voice of the youth and begin dialogue with them," he said.

Referring to the police action during the proposed Parliament march on July 20, Gehlot alleged that students, including women and minors, were lathi-charged and tear gas shells were fired to disperse demonstrators.

He also questioned the removal of barricades at the protest site before the police action, saying it remains unclear why barricades were removed when the agitation was going on.

Gehlot said students from different parts of the country had joined the agitation because they felt there was no

mechanism to address their grievances.

He claimed the issue had gone beyond examination paper leaks and reflected wider public anger over unemployment, inflation and the functioning of constitutional institutions.

The former chief minister also alleged that mainstream media had failed to adequately highlight the concerns of students and appealed to it to report independently. "The media has a vital role in informing the public about people's problems. If it continues to function under pressure, history will not forgive it," Sachin Pilot, in a post on X on Tuesday, echoed similar concerns, alleging that the police action against students on Monday had drawn widespread con-

demnation. "The lathi-charge on students has been condemned across the country. The youth are hurt and distressed. Injustice has been done to them and their future has been jeopardised," he said.

The former deputy chief minister said Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra and several MPs were staging a dharna outside the PM's residence to express solidarity with students protesting against alleged irregularities in recruitment examinations. He urged the Centre to listen to the concerns of students and accept their demands. "The voice of students must be heard and their demands should be accepted. Everyone should unite in support of students and their fight for justice," he said.

SC directs AIIMS to constitute medical board to assess health of Asaram

THE SUPREME COURT on Tuesday asked the director of AIIMS to constitute a medical board to assess the condition of self-styled godman Asaram, who has sought interim bail on medical grounds.

The Rajasthan High Court on May 27 upheld the conviction and life sentence awarded to the octogenarian in a case of rape of a minor in 2013.

A bench of justices M M Sundresh and P B Varale asked the medical board to submit its report within a week.

During the hearing, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta submitted that just three months ago Asaram undertook journeys to Kashi Vishwanath and Ayodhya.

"He got the bail on the ground that he was in vegetative state. But now he is roaming around," Mehta said. "We are not granting regular bail except if we are satisfied it is required on a medical ground. Let the report come," the bench said.

The counsel appearing for Asaram said the petitioner's case may be referred to the director of AIIMS, who may constitute a team of doctors to conduct a thorough examination.

He said the doctors can then submit a report on whether he should be admitted as a patient.

The HC had upheld Asaram's conviction in the case,

but acquitted him of charges related to alleged gangrape and penetrative sexual assault on a child under the erstwhile Indian Penal Code and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

However, the HC upheld his conviction under IPC Section 376(2)(F) pertaining to rape of the minor, thereby retaining the sentence of life imprisonment awarded by the trial court.

The HC had also upheld convictions under several other provisions, including Sections 342 (wrongful confinement), 370(4) (trafficking), 506 (criminal intimidation), 509 (insulting the modesty of a woman), 354(A) (sexual harassment) of the IPC, along with Sections 7/8 of the POCSO Act and Section 23 of the Juvenile Justice Act.

Earlier, Asaram was convicted on April 25, 2018 for sexually assaulting a minor student at his ashram and was sentenced to life imprisonment under multiple provisions of the IPC, the POCSO Act, and Juvenile Justice Act.
