OPPOSITION DEMANDS HOME MINISTERAMIT SHAH’S COMMENT ON POLICE ACTION

Clash in RS over anti-paper leak Bill

New Delhi, July 30

A DAY AFTER it was cleared by Lok Sabha, the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Amendment Bill, 2026, was taken up in Rajya Sabha on Thursday.

Initiating the discussion in the afternoon, Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge demanded Home Minister Amit Shah’s resignation. “Paper churane wale bachte rahe, mehnat karne wale pit te rahe. Yeh kaisa nyay” (Those behind paper leaks kept escaping, those who worked hard kept getting beaten up. What kind of justice is this), he said, alleging that the government had ignored demands for a strong law against paper leaks in 2024.

Union Minister Jitendra Singh, who moved the Bill in the House, said the amendments reflect the government’s willingness to “learn from experience” after the implementation of the 2024 law. “In the wake of the recent sequence of events, PM Modi lost no time in declaring that nobody would be allowed to jeopardise the students’ future.

There is a zero tolerance policy. This legislation seeks to make the law more stringent. It is my humble request to all leaders in the House to help pass the Bill,” he said.

However, Kharge said the amendments merely enhanced penalties and created new enforcement mechanisms without addressing the root causes of recurring paper leaks. “The Bill that has come to

the House for discussion only has modified numbers — higher penalties, stricter punishment and the special task force. This is not going to make any difference. The question is how to strengthen the exam system so that paper leaks don’t happen,” he said.

Kharge claimed the Opposition had suggested similar reforms in 2024, but the government had ignored them.

Amid repeated interruptions by the treasury benches during his hour-long interjection, Kharge questioned the use of force against students and sought accountability for the police action. “Who authorised the use of lathicharges, tear gas and pellet guns on students? Who were the people in plain-clothes beating up students? Under whose orders do the RAF and CRPF operate?”, he asked.

Removal of PM’s post: Govt, Meta to hold talks

THE GOVERNMENT WILL hold discussions with social media major Meta on policy and technical matters within a week over several concerns, including the removal of Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s Facebook post, a senior government official said on Thursday.

The government has summoned Meta’s public policy head after Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s Facebook post, on July 23, addressing India’s youth and promising stringent measures against exam paper leaks, was briefly restricted by the US-headquartered social media giant.

Electronics and IT Secretary S Krishnan said that the government has asked Meta to come in at the highest level and explain the issue that led to the glitch.

India’s most powerful women command ₹39L cr in wealth

INDIA’S MOST INFLUENTIAL women today are creating their own paths rather than inheriting them, according to the second edition of the Candere Hurun India Women Leaders List released on Thursday.

The list identifies 117 women achievers across 12 categories, who together represent ₹39 lakh crore in enterprise value, wealth and market capitalisation.

What is significant, however, is that 84% of these women are self-made, outnumbering those who inherited their wealth by over five to one.

While in past decades, the country’s most influential women were dominated by business heirs and corporate veterans, the Hurun listing features a wide range of women achievers such as entrepreneurs, journalists, digital creators, authors and Olympic medallists.

Some of the country’s best-known names feature on the list such as Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw, Roshni Nadar Malhotra, Falguni Nayar, Nisaba Godrej, Sudha Murty, Anita Dongre, Masaba Gupta, PV Sindhu, Mary Kom and Manu Bhaker.

The upper end of the rankings is dominated by leaders of large businesses, though the report emphasises that readership, audience growth and sports achievements are also important parameters beyond financial metrics.

HCLTech chairperson Roshni Nadar Malhotra, with a net worth of ₹2.84 lakh crore, leads the wealth multipliers category, while Hindustan Unilever CEO Priya Nair tops the professional CEOs category, leading a company valued at over ₹5 lakh crore.

Preetha Reddy and Suneeta Reddy of Apollo Hospitals take the top place in the veterans’ category with a group valuation exceeding ₹1.21 lakh crore.

Vaishali Nigam Sinha topped the new economy rankings with ReNew Power, valued

at ₹22,230 crore.

The single largest category features Olympic and Paralympic medallists, accounting for 20 names, 60% of which are para-athletes.

The list also reflects the role of digital and social media in building influence.

For example, Faye D’Souza leads in the independent journalists’ category with over 22,00,000 Instagram followers, while Ananya Birla tops the social media influencers’

category, recording the fastest follower growth in one year.

Other digital influencers shaping public discourse on the list include Twinkle Khanna, Namita Thapar, Barkha Dutt and Kusha Kapila. Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw has earned the distinction of being the most-followed honouree on LinkedIn, with over 10,00,000 followers, while 75-year-old Sudha Murty leads the category of authors with the highest readership impact score.

Neeraj, Rohit and Yashvir enter CWG javelin final

OLYMPIC HERO NEERAJ Chopra, along with two other Indians, advanced to the Commonwealth Games men’s javelin throw final after finishing among the top 12 in the qualification round as strong, shifting winds foiled every athlete’s attempt to achieve the

automatic qualifying mark here on Thursday.

Chopra, who won the javelin throw title in 2018, was fifth with a best effort of 79.61m, while Rohit Yadav (78.37m) and Yashvir Singh (78.36m) ended the qualification in ninth and 10th positions respectively to

ensure a full Indian contingent in the medal round.

The 28-year-old Chopra, who was the last thrower in each round, did not take his third and final attempt as he had already made it to the final by that time.

With a steady headwind

and a temperature of 18 degree Celsius making conditions difficult throughout the event, none of the competitors was able to breach the automatic qualification mark of 84m, leaving the top 12 athletes to progress to the final round to be held on Friday.

“The conditions were not the best for javelin throwers. It was not only cold but also windy. And the wind was coming from all directions... it was really hard to assess which side it will come from. And lots of throwers were struggling today, no automatic qualification,” Chopra told reporters after the event.

“It was difficult to keep ourselves warm also. We were trying

to understand the conditions during the warm up throws but nobody was able to decode. The athletes put in a lot of effort but the wind dictated terms. A lot of them will be unhappy today because I don’t think anyone would be satisfied with their throw,” Chopra added.

Only four competitors could breach the 80m mark.

Sri Lanka’s in-form Rumesh Tharanga Pathirage, winner of the Doha and Rome Diamond League meetings this season, topped the qualification with a first-round throw of 82.84m. Last edition silver winner Anderson Peters of Grenada was second with a best throw of 81.29m.
