Urgent need to fill potholes immediately

Chairman keeps proposal pending regarding consultant's fee and price hike for construction of Subhash Bridge



Ahmedabad

The monsoon has begun in the city, but small and large potholes are still visible in many places. The potholes have also appeared due to improper filling after the excavations done by the Municipal Corporation for water, sewage and other works, which have been instructed to be repaired with immediate effect in the Road and Building Committee.

Instructions to fill potholes and install barricades around the earth etc.

Chairman Jainik Vakil said that many cases of road settlement are coming to the fore due to lack of proper filling after excavation in the city. The additional engineers of the road project and seven zones have been instructed to quickly complete the pothole filling work on days when there is no rain in the monsoon and to install proper barricades around the earth etc. In order to know whether the potholes are repaired or not and not just empty figures are given, the engineer officers of each zone have been instructed to send two photos of the potholes before and after repair. The problem of

potholes on the road and road subsidence is serious, but efforts will be made to resolve it in the coming days.

Instructions to dispose of rainwater:

Regarding the problem of the surrounding societies being submerged due to the increase in road height due to road resurfacing in several areas of the city and the flooding of rainwater, he said that this matter will also be addressed and instructions have been given to make a slope from the central verge towards the footpath when the road is resurfaced and to make a catch pit near the footpath to dispose of rainwater.

The proposal proposed in the Road and Building Committee

is to completely demolish the controversial Subhash Bridge of the city and build a new one, regarding which the proposal put forward by the Bridge Project Department officer regarding the increase in the price for consultant's fee and labor and labor has been decided by the Chairman of the Road and Building Committee, Jainik Vakil, until the next committee. The proposed

proposal has been next in the Road and Building Committee due to the fact that the Engineering Department of AMC has not clarified any technical issues including the previously determined estimate and the amount of the approved tender, the consultant's fee should not be subject to GST and if the estimate-based tender is approved as per the old SOR, VAT or GST will have to be removed, etc.

A proposal other than GST should be brought on consultant fees.

Road and Building Committee Chairman Jainik Vakil said that GST is not levied on consultant fees. Therefore, a proposal other than GST should be brought on consultant fees. As per the terms of the tender, price increase is given on steel, cement, bitumen, etc. But why should price increase be given on labor and POL according to the price difference? When asked such a burning question, the officials of the Municipal Engineer Department could not give any satisfactory answer and remained silent. The Commissioner has asked to talk to the consultant on the issue of reducing the consultant.

It is believed that the officials of the Engineering Department have been using the tricky language of paying/ recovering the price variation amount as per the formula based on the price difference between the old SOR and the new SOR, the index based formula, in addition to the tender amount, to the contractor as per the formula based on the direct price difference of steel, cement, labor, material, POL and bitumen.

GJU Defends Press Freedom

When a defamation notice knocks on the newsroom, who defends the public's right to know? This fundamental question echoed in Visnagar on 21st July as the Gujarat Journalists Union (GJU) took to the streets to defend the independence of the press and the dignity of journalism.

In a strong show of solidarity, the Gujarat Journalists Union rallied behind Jayeshbhai Vyas, Editor of the Gujarati weekly Lokshahi Samarthan, and demanded the immediate withdrawal of a defamation notice served to him by Visnagar City President Khushalbhai Patel. A GJU delegation led by State President B. R. Prajapati submitted a formal memorandum to the Visnagar Prant Officer at 11:30 a.m. Journalists from Kadi, Visnagar, Vadnagar and

Mehsana participated in large numbers, turning the protest into a collective assertion that journalist intimidation will not be tolerated in a democracy.

Addressing the gathering, GJU leaders said that bringing political and social developments before the public is not an act of defamation but the core professional duty of every journalist. "Jayeshbhai Vyas has only done what journalism demands - to inform, to question and to hold power accountable. To label this as defamation is to misunderstand the very purpose of a free press," the Union stated. GJU demanded that the notice be withdrawn unconditionally and that the Visnagar city president tender a public apology to the journalist community for attempting to create an atmosphere of fear.

The Union further emphasized that an independent and fearless media is essential for the health of democracy. It urged all public representatives to respect the role of the press and to understand that criticism, when based on facts and public interest, is not an attack but a service to society. "Press freedom cannot be gagged by pressure, notices, or threats. Reporting truth is not a crime," GJU leaders asserted.

Citing the framework of the Press Council of India, the GJU said its position is fully aligned with established Press Council of India norms on journalistic



GJU has urged the state government and administration to intervene and ensure that journalists can work without fear or pressure.

The delegation that submitted the memorandum included GJU President B. R. Prajapati, Vice-President Jagdish Brahmabhatt, Dr. Nikhil Shah, Jayeshbhai Vyas, General Secretary Natwarlal Bhatt, Joint Secretary Vinay Pandya, Treasurer Nilesh Vora, Executive Members Anil Verma and Paresh Mehta, Office Secretary Jagdish Meva, along with senior members and working journalists from across North Gujarat. The Visnagar episode has once again brought the

debate on media freedom in Gujarat to the forefront. It raises a critical democratic question: should journalists limit themselves to reporting only what is comfortable to those in power, or should the constitutional right to question, scrutinize and inform remain the cornerstone of journalism in India? IN/OUT online registration resumes in Girnar after a hiccup

Junagadh, Keeping in mind the safety of pilgrims on Girnar mountain in Junagadh, the administration announced to start 'IN/OUT' online registration for movement from today (July 18). The administration claimed that pilgrims will be able to easily register by scanning the QR code on the spot.

But when Divya Bhaskar's

team went to ground zero and did a reality check on the entire matter, the reality was somewhat different. No scanners, in-out arrangements or online registration were seen at the starting point of the Girnar climb. As if this announcement by the administration had remained only on paper, the registration process was hectic on the first

day itself and the apathy of the administration was clearly visible. After Bhaskar's team went to ground zero and did a reality check, the system came into action at 2 pm and started the registration process. 'All people are going up only after registering'

Regarding the fact that this registration was not started on time, SDM Nikunj Dhuda said

that registration is not a part of any government notification. But it is an administrative step taken as a part of maintaining administrative order. The notification issued by the administration has been implemented only in connection with the Silence Zone and Nirvana Laddu Festival. Currently, this registration process has been

started and all people are going up only after registering, which can also be confirmed by checking the place. IN/OUT QR codes were not put up in the morning. Tourists who came here seemed very eager to do digital registration themselves, but they had to face a lot of trouble due to the lack of any system available on the ground.

Will crores of public money be burnt in a leafy shed?

Surat

Another controversial chapter has been added to the tradition of political discussions and approvals of Surat Municipal Corporation. Under the pretext of solving the traffic problem in Trikamnagar area of ??Varachha Zone-A, the proposal to build a new modern vegetable market at a whopping cost of about Rs. 2.64 crore has finally been given the green signal by the standing committee of the municipal corporation's ruling party. In the last meeting, this work was postponed as a waste of public money, the same work had to be presented by the administration with revised reasons within a few days after intense political pressure and 'dhampacha' from the local MLA and the committee has upheld it. Following this decision, many questions are

now being raised in Surat politics and at the local level.

Primary facilities will be developed for vegetable vendors

As per the proposal submitted by the Surat Municipal Corporation administration and approved by the standing committee, this new vegetable market will be constructed at Final Plot No. 23 of T.P. Scheme No. 3 under Varachha Zone-A. An estimated Rs. 2.64 crore will be spent on this project. Talking about the features of the market, this market will be fully equipped with modern facilities. A large sheet shed will be constructed to avoid any trouble for the vendors and customers during the monsoon and summer seasons. Primary facilities like platforms, clean drinking water system as well as drainage and toilets will be developed for the vegetable

vendors. Why was the work postponed in the last meeting?

The story behind the approval of this project is very interesting. Earlier, when this proposal came up for discussion in the standing committee meeting, the committee members themselves raised serious objections to it. It was pointed out to the members that a government vegetable market owned by the municipal corporation already exists just 700 to 800 meters away from the place where the new market is proposed to be built.

The most surprising thing is that this old market is not used by the local hawkers or the public at all. Most of the shops and stalls there have been vacant for years and the atmosphere is like a ghost street. When a government structure worth crores of rupees is gathering dust at a distance of 250 meters.

Family in uproar over death of beloved daughter

Surat

Surat's famous Kiran Hospital has once again come under the scanner of controversy. The sudden death of a 9-month-old baby girl from a simple family living in Katargam area during treatment at the hospital has created a huge uproar in the hospital premises. The family of the deceased girl has

accused the hospital doctors and staff of serious medical negligence. The family claims that after the needle was removed from the girl's neck, her health suddenly deteriorated and she breathed her last soon after. Following this incident, the hospital system has become overwhelmed and the atmosphere has become

tense. Katargam police have immediately reached the spot and started an investigation. Hospitalized due to deteriorating health According to the information received, Miteshbhai Chaudhary lives with his family in Khodiyar Krupa Society in Katargam area of ??Surat. In his family, 9-month-old innocent daughter Krishna was loved by everyone as she was the first daughter of the family. On July 10, innocent Krishna's health suddenly deteriorated. Seeing the delicate condition of the girl, the family took her to the nearby Kiran Hospital for immediate treatment. Where, after the advice of the doctors, the girl was formally admitted to the hospital on the 11th and her treatment was started.

After the needle was removed, the condition worsened and she died.

After being admitted to the hospital, the girl was undergoing intensive treatment. Meanwhile, an incident took place yesterday, Friday, which

shook the family's world. It is alleged that during the treatment, a needle was removed from the girl's neck. According to the family, the girl's physical condition became extremely serious shortly after the needle was removed from the neck. As soon as Masoom Krishna's health suddenly deteriorated, the staff present there rushed to help, but the doctors could not save her and she sadly died soon after. Mother's allegation: Sister removed the needle and my daughter died. Crying in front of the media following the death of her daughter, mother Kirtika Miteshbhai Chaudhary made scathing allegations against the hospital management. She said with a heavy heart that my daughter had undergone a valve operation and about a week had passed since the operation. Her condition was normal after the operation, but the other day, not a head doctor or an experienced paramedical doctor, but a nurse from the hospital's nursing staff

removed the needle from my daughter's neck.

Only after removing this needle, my daughter's health deteriorated completely and she died. This statement of the mother has raised big questions about the performance of the hospital staff. The family was shattered by the death of one of their daughters. The family was outraged and demand to meet the head doctor. The sudden death of the first daughter in the family under such mysterious and suspicious circumstances has plunged the entire Chaudhary family into deep grief. The anger of the father and relatives who lost their beloved daughter reached the seventh heaven. The family had taken up a front against the hospital administration and created a ruckus with serious allegations that the daughter's life was lost due to the gross negligence of the doctors.
