Mid-sized office spaces gain traction in Ahmedabad

Ahmedabad, According to Knight Frank India, leasing activity in the 50,000–100,000 sq ft office space category in Ahmedabad witnessed significant growth during H1 2026, with transaction volumes increasing 121% YoY to 0.27 million square feet (mn sq ft) from 0.12 mn sq ft in H1 2025. Moreover, the share of mid-sized office transactions rose sharply from 15% to 33%, indicating that one-third of the total office space leased in Ahmedabad during H1 2026 comprised transactions in the 50,000–100,000 sq ft category, compared with 15% in the corresponding period last year. This trend points to a growing preference among occupiers for scalable office formats while maintaining operational flexibility. Rumi Parikh, National Director – Occupier Strategy & Solutions, Retail, Industrial & Logistics, and Branch Head –



Ahmedabad & Indore, Knight Frank India, said, "Ahmedabad's office market is witnessing a gradual evolution in occupier requirements, with demand increasingly shifting towards mid-sized office spaces that offer the right balance between scalability and cost efficiency. As businesses expand their operations and seek future-ready workplaces, we expect this segment to remain a key contributor to leasing activity. (13-9)

Several liver conditions can present during infancy or childhood, including biliary atresia, genetic and metabolic liver disorders, autoimmune liver diseases, and chronic viral infections. FY27 RoA guidance revised upwards to 1.8% to 2.0%



Ahmedabad, Ujjivan Small Finance Bank Ltd. [BSE: 542904; NSE: UJJIIVANSFB], today announced its financial performance for the quarter ended June 2026. Ms. Carol Furtado, ED Ujjivan Small Finance Bank said "Despite ongoing global market uncertainties, domestic high-frequency economic indicators have shown stability. Water enters multi-crore bungalow in Ahmedabad, 200 vehicles parked in basement submerged



Ahmedabad' Ahmedabad city received an average of 20 inches of rain on the 23rd, causing waterlogging in most areas of the city. People were helpless as water filled everything from the basement of the society to the bungalows. The army was forced to be deployed to rescue the trapped people in the society behind the Karnavati Club. The Chief Minister himself also rushed to Ahmedabad from Gandhinagar and visited the affected areas of Bopal-Ambli. Due to the flooding of the society and bungalows, lakhs of rupees of damage has been caused to people's homes and vehicles, which is difficult to estimate at present.

A holiday has been declared for schools and colleges on Saturday as heavy rains are still forecast in the city. While a holiday has been declared for anganwadis till July 27.

Bungalows worth crores of rupees also got submerged. Sentosa Park, located behind the Karnavati Club in the city, was seen filled with water up to the chest. As water entered the bungalows in this posh area, the valuable household items and luxury cars of the people also got submerged.

As it became difficult to get out on foot or in small vehicles, the army had to rescue the people with the help of boats. Such a low pressure system has the potential to bring heavy to very heavy rainfall in a short time, due to which the Meteorological Department had to change the warning color to red alert. Apart from this, this entire round of rain may continue till August 3, during which the possibility of rain increase in other parts of Kutch and Saurashtra has been expressed.

Water entered 300 bungalows in Applewood Villas.

A similar situation to that of Sentosa Park was seen in Applewood Villas in Shela area. There are about 300 luxurious bungalows here. Rainwater flooded the society to such an extent that the houses were knee-deep in water. In one bungalow, a sick

Mystery surrounds death of wife who fell from 13th floor

Gandhinagar, A 29-year-old married woman died after falling from the 13th floor of an under-construction flat called Stavya Sky in Palaj village near Gandhinagar. In what appears to be a case of accidental fall, the deceased's father has filed a complaint at Chiloda police station, seriously alleging that his son-in-law forced his daughter to die by continuously torturing her physically and mentally.

According to the complaint filed by Ghanshyambhai Ravirambhai Gondaliya, a farmer and resident of Juna Jashapar village in Sayla taluka of Surendranagar district, his daughter Poojaben got married to Ravibhai Bakuldas Desani (sadhru), a native of Mota Bhadla village, in the year 2018 as per social customs. During this marriage, they also have two children named Yug and Yagya. Son-in-law Ravibhai, a taxi driver by profession, had been living in a rented house in Palaj village with his family for the last one and a half years.

person could not get out and the fire brigade personnel made a rope and rescued him. The people living here have been forced to take shelter in relatives' houses and hotels. Chief Minister visits affected areas

The Chief Minister had arrived in Ahmedabad to assess the condition of the affected societies in Bopal, Shela and Ambli areas. He visited the affected areas and held a meeting with the

officials of Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation and instructed them to immediately drain the water. 200 vehicles submerged in Shela's Akash Residency

The residents of Shela area were the most affected by the heavy rains that fell on Thursday. The basement of Akash Residency here was filled with 10 feet of water, drowning about 200 vehicles. The basement of Meher Homes-3, which is similar to

Akash Residency, was seen recently. Here, vehicles were submerged as water entered the basement from the road. As part of safety, the society's lights were switched off, which doubled the problems of the people.

900 people trapped in Bavla's Gallops Park rescued Water-bombing scenes were also witnessed in the Bavla industrial area, adjacent to Ahmedabad city.

Around 900 people were rescued with the help of boats and tractors after they were trapped in the Gallops Industrial Park here.
