NEET standoff spreads nationwide

WAR OF WORDS. Govt pushes for House debate; Opposition links discussion to Pradhan’s exit

The tussle between the Opposition and the ruling NDA coalition over fixing accountability on NEET examination paper leak continued on Wednesday, with Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju saying that the government is ready for discussion in the House on education reform but the Congress is bringing new conditions to scuttle the debate.

Outside Parliament, the protest seeking resignation of Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan for the NEET paper leak has spread beyond Jantar Mantar to Mumbai, Chandigarh, Patna, Bengaluru and Hyderabad, among other places, voicing solidarity with the Delhi agitators. At Jantar Mantar, supporters continue to pour to support Cockroach Janta Party’s movement.

The government expressed its readiness to resolve the issue of students. CJP chief spokesperson Saurav Das said police in-

formed the outfit on Wednesday morning that Union Health Minister JP Nadda wanted to hold discussions and had invited them to his residence.

“We refused to go to anyone’s house or office. The people’s court is here. Ministers should come among the people. If they want to talk, the talks should be held at Jantar Mantar,” he said.

Meanwhile, Congress President and MP Mallikarjun Kharge said in the Rajya Sabha that Pradhan should resign for a fair discussion to

take place on fixing accountability over several paper leak and education reform.

“If there has to be a fair discussion, the Education Minister should resign first. Until he resigns, there won’t be a fair discussion here,” he said.

OPPOSITION DEMAND
DMK’s Tiruchi Siva joined the Opposition demanding a discussion under Rule 267, which requires suspension of specific rules related to listed business in the Rajya Sabha. To that, Parliamentary Af-

fairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said, “We have said from day one that the government is always prepared to discuss any matter concerning the national interest and the interests of the youth. However, it has to be decided under which rule the discussion will take place. There is a proper system for holding discussions in Parliament. Taking to the streets and creating a ruckus is not the right approach. The discussion should be meaningful.”

But the Congress is introducing new conditions to create obstacles in the debate to happen, he added.

After Prime Minister Narendra Modi set the template of engagement on the issue during the NDA meeting a day earlier, the government fielded Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to attack the Opposition and at the same time reach out to the protesting youth to blunt the charge that the NDA was unresponsive and heavy-handed.

Singh said the ongoing protests in Delhi were a matter of serious concern. “It is extremely unfortunate that

some people are trying to use our students and youth as political tools to serve their own vested interests.”

“Under the leadership of PM Modi, our government remains fully committed to fulfilling the aspirations of students and young people and ensuring their welfare. It is our responsibility to listen to every concern of our students and address it. I have complete faith that India’s aware, mature, and discerning youth understand such misleading attempts and will choose the path of progress, development and nation-building,” stated the Defence Minister.

Rahul Gandhi demanded that Modi immediately removes Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, apologises to the students and take action against those responsible for the repressive action against protesting students.

Addressing a press conference, Gandhi said, “They are not terrorists; they are our future,” adding that the Congress party stands “100 per cent” with the students’ demands.

CJI declines to take cognisance of alleged police violence during CJP’s Parliament march

The Supreme Court on Wednesday declined to initiate *suo motu* proceedings to take cognisance of alleged police excesses during the July 20 crackdown on student protesters in the national capital.

When a lawyer submitted that there was videographic evidence of police brutality against the protesters, Chief Justice of India (CJI) Surya Kant orally declined to examine the videos, saying that the court’s time should not be “wasted”.

Mentioning the matter before a Bench headed by the Chief Justice, the lawyer urged the court to take cognisance of the alleged police violence against the student protesters.

He pointed out that thousands of students had gathered for the “Chalo Sansad” protest organised by the Cockroach Janta Party (CJP), demanding fair entrance examinations, reforms in the National Testing Agency (NTA), and the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan over alleged examination paper leaks.

“The protest is already going on in Jantar Mantar. The police are already taking brutal actions,” the lawyer submitted.

The Chief Justice, however, cut him short. “Don’t waste our time, and don’t waste your time,” he told the lawyer.

The lawyer nevertheless attempted to persuade the Bench, submitting that the protest centred on issues affecting lakhs of students, including the conduct of the NEET examination and reforms in the NTA.

As the Bench, also comprising Justices Joymalya Bagchi and V Mohan, indicated that it was not inclined to hear him further, the lawyer said he had a collection of videos purportedly showing police personnel assaulting unarmed protesters and offered to place them before the court.

The top court’s observations came a day after Delhi High Court Chief Justice DK

Upadhyaya also refused to grant an urgent hearing on a plea challenging the alleged police violence.

Declining the request for immediate listing, the Chief Justice remarked, “Don’t drag the Court into this.”

CJI’S CLARIFICATION
The Chief Justice’s reported remark on “cockroach” in reference to fake law degree holders during the hearing of a writ petition on May 15 spawned public furore and a viral online platform, the Cockroach Janta Party, which is spearheading the protests at Delhi’s Jantar Mantar.

The Chief Justice had offered a “clarification” the following day in a statement that he was misquoted by sections of the media and had the greatest concern and respect for the youths of the country.

On Monday, the Delhi Police cracked down on the “Chalo Sansad” protest called by the CJP, leaving several protesters injured.

The police action came amid an internet shutdown in the New Delhi district, even as CJP representatives Saurav Das and Ashutosh Ranka met Union Health Minister JP Nadda to formally seek the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan.

The police action has since sparked a political storm, with Opposition MPs protesting inside and outside Parliament before marching to Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s residence on Tuesday.

Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi subsequently called on PM Modi to apologise to the students affected by the police crackdown.

Pellet injury in Delhi protest leaves 19-year-old on the brink of blindness

Nineteen-year-old Sahil Lochab was waving the national flag at the Jantar Mantar protest when a pellet struck his right eye. Within moments, blood streamed down his face, staining his white shirt. He was taken to Lady Hardinge Medical College before being referred to the AIIMS Trauma Centre, where doctors are battling to save his vision.

A senior doctor at AIIMS Delhi, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Sahil had suffered a pellet injury. “A pellet injury to the eye is considered a medical emergency and can cause catastrophic damage, including a ruptured eyeball, internal bleeding, retinal detachment, cataracts and traumatic optic neuropathy. In many cases, pellets become lodged inside the eye or orbit, requiring complex microsurgical procedures,” he said.

The Delhi Police said they do not possess pellet guns and do not use them. However, paramilitary forces, including the Rapid Action Force (RAF), a specialised 15-battalion wing of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), were deployed during the July 20 protest.

Sitting outside the surgery ward, his mother Jyoti struggled to come to terms with the prognosis. “The pellet entered his eye and ruptured the pupil. Doctors have told us there is only a one per cent chance that vision in his right eye can be restored,” she said.

A resident of Najafgarh, Sahil is a final-year student at the School of Open Learning,

He aspired to join the Delhi Police and was preparing for the head constable recruitment examination.

He had also appeared for the Staff Selection Commission’s Combined Graduate Level (SSC-CGL) examination for recruitment to Group B and C posts in central government departments.

According to Jyoti, Sahil had been visiting Jantar Mantar for the past two days and was strongly concerned about issues related to the country’s education system. “Everyone was going, so he also decided to go. I didn’t stop him. He told me that since he is a college student, he too should protest,” she said.

His friend, Parvesh Madaan, described Sahil as someone deeply engaged with issues affecting students. “He is very concerned about such matters. He was simply waving the national flag when the Delhi Police started using pellet guns,” he alleges.

Jyoti demanded to know why pellets and tear gas shells were used on peaceful protesters. “How can they do this to young children who only want to build their careers. It’s the responsibility of the government to see who fired the pellet gun,” she

said. Sahil underwent one surgery on Monday night and requires another. Doctors have also removed pellets lodged in his body, but remain uncertain about the possibility of restoring vision in his injured eye.

PELLET VICTIMS

About 9 km away, at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Sheikh Irshad Mansoor is recovering after a pellet struck just below his eye, narrowly missing the eyeball.

His friend, Vikas, said Irshad’s condition has improved and that his family is travelling from Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh, to be with him.

“One pellet is still lodged in his neck and will have to be removed. Surgeons have already operated to remove another pellet from below his eye,” Vikas said.

Irshad, who works at a private company, had gone to Connaught Place for work before deciding to join the protest.

“He was hit near Palika Bazaar in Connaught Place by a Rapid Action Force (RAF) personnel in uniform,” Vikas alleges.

On Tuesday, Irshad also met Union Health Minister JP Nadda.

Meanwhile, an official at Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital, speaking on condition of anonymity, said around 65 protesters and 10 police personnel were brought to the emergency department on Monday with injuries ranging from head trauma to fractures. Among them was a 21-year-old woman who was admitted to the intensive care unit in critical condition. Hospital officials said she is now stable.

Man gets 20 yrs' RI for raping minor under false marriage promise

A Principal Sessions Court in Kancheepuram on Tuesday sentenced a 31-year-old man to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act for sexually assaulting a 17-year-old girl after allegedly luring her with a false promise of marriage.

The convict, Yuvaraj (31), a native of Villupuram district, was arrested by the SRMC All Women Police Station in June 2019 following a complaint from the survivor, a resident of Mangadu.

According to the prosecution, Yuvaraj sexually assaulted the minor under the pretext of marriage and later threatened her. After completing the investigation, the police filed the charge sheet before the Principal Sessions Court in Kancheepuram.

The court sentenced Yuvaraj to one-year of RI under Section 417 of the IPC, two years under Section 506(1) of the IPC, two years under Section 4 of the TN Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act along with a fine of ₹10,000, and 20 years RI under Section 6 of the Pocso Act. The sentences will run concurrently. The state was also told to pay ₹5 lakh to the survivor.

A first-year college student suffered facial and hand injuries after falling from the footboard of an overcrowded State Express Transport Corporation (SETC) bus near Koolur on the Chennai-Tirupati National Highway on Wednesday, leading to a protest by commuters demanding additional bus services on the Tiruvallur-Tiruttani route.

The injured, S Vasanth (18), a resident of Kanchippadi village in Thiruvallangadu Union and a first-year undergraduate student at the Government Arts College, Tiruttani, had boarded the SETC bus from Tiruvallur to attend classes.

According to sources, the bus was packed with passengers and students, forcing Vasanth to travel on the footboard. Near Koolur, he allegedly lost his balance and fell off the moving bus. He is undergoing treatment at the Tiruvallur Government Medical College Hospital where sources said his condition is stable.

"We have only one private bus and one SETC bus on this route. The buses are always overcrowded and often arrive late, making us late for school. We request the government to operate more buses, so students do not have to risk travelling on the footboard," said a school student, requesting anonymity.

held talks with the protesters, following which the agitation was withdrawn.

A Anbazhagan, president of All Omni Bus Owners' Association and a researcher on transport-related accidents, said data released by the Union Ministry of Road Transport and Highways in 2024 showed that nearly 48% of fatal bus-related accidents were caused by passengers falling from

footboards or losing balance while boarding or alighting. "The government should not only increase bus services to reduce overcrowding but also intensify awareness campaigns on the risks of footboard travel," he said.

However, the Tiruvallur District Transport Department General Manager disputed the sequence of events, stating the student had attempted to alight

before the bus reached the stop. "There are adequate buses operating on this route. Public awareness against footboard travel is equally important," the official said.

The official also recalled an incident last week in which a student hurled stones at an SETC bus after the conductor asked him to move inside instead of travelling on the footboard.

Man on the run in Cambodia cyber crime cases arrested from airport

AFTER a search of more than two years, a 33-year-old man from Karur, wanted in multiple digital scams including cyber slavery, digital arrest and cheating by recruiting people from Tamil Nadu for cyber slavery operations in Cambodia, was arrested by the West Zone Cyber Crime police in Chennai after he arrived at the Chennai airport from Cambodia on Tuesday.

The suspect, B Ilavarasan, against whom a Look Out Circular (LOC) had been issued, was remanded in judicial custody. The police seized his passport, foreign work permit,

Cambodian currency and a mobile phone.

The case stems from a complaint lodged by MK Ezhilvani (59) of Kolathur, who was allegedly duped in February 2024 after fraudsters posing as Delhi Customs and police officials falsely claimed



she was linked to a parcel containing passports, ATM cards and MDMA, and to a money laundering case. Fearing arrest, she transferred ₹2.96 lakh to an HDFC Bank account in Anthiyur, Erode.

The police had arrested Prema and Bala alias Balakrishnan in 2024. Investigators later identified Ilavarasan as an agent for Chinese-run scam centres in Cambodia, arranging Indian bank accounts and luring job seekers with promises of computer-related work before forcing them into cyber fraud operations. The police said he is also wanted in multiple cyber slavery and cheating cases across Tamil Nadu.

US techie held for sending bomb threat emails for last two yrs

THE TN Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) on Tuesday detained a US-based software engineer at Chennai International Airport in connection with a series of hoax bomb threat emails sent between 2023 and 2025 targeting airports, educational institutions, public officials and other high-profile establishments across the country.

The suspect, Sarath Subramanian Shankar (37), a native of Ambasamudram in Tirunelveli district, had been residing in Austin, Texas, where he worked for a software company. He was intercepted by immigration officials after arriving in Chennai on an Etihad Airways flight and was taken into ATS custody for questioning.

According to investigators, Sarath used the dark web to send anonymous bomb threat emails targeting commercial flights, schools, colleges and public figures. Each threat triggered extensive security checks by Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad personnel before being declared a hoax. "Such hoax bomb threats cause panic, disrupt airline operations and result in huge financial losses," a senior ATS officer told TNIE.

Investigators said they established the suspect's identity and monitored his movements for nearly six months before issuing a Look Out Circular (LOC), leading to his detention upon arrival in Chennai. Officials said the ATS has registered 33 cases, while more than 100 related cases have been booked by various investigating agencies.

Hubby arrested a day after woman's death

Chennai: A day after a 24-year-old woman was found dead at her house, the Royapettah police detained her husband on Wednesday following protests by her relatives alleging she was subjected to dowry harassment. The police said the woman's family staged a road blockade outside the Government Royapettah Hospital. The deceased, Reshma of Royapettah, had married Kumar in 2021, and the couple has a one-and-a-half-year-old daughter. ENS

Ex-MLA's son run over by earthmover, friend injured

CHENNAI: The 21-year-old son of former AIADMK MLA P Periya Pullan was killed and his friend injured after the motorcycle on which they were riding hit a road median and he was run over by an earthmover near Anna University on Wednesday morning.

The deceased, P Ulagapathi, was a second-year law student at a private college in Guindy. He was staying in Thiruvannamiyur. According to the police, Ulagapathi was riding the motorcycle to college with his friend as the pillion when he allegedly lost control of the vehicle near Anna University. The motorcycle hit the road median, throwing both riders on to the carriageway.

An earthmover travelling behind the motorcycle allegedly ran over Ulagapathi, killing him on the spot. His friend sustained injuries. The Adyar Traffic Investigation Wing booked the earthmover driver, Rajesh (40), under relevant provisions. ENS

Regular exercise may rewire brain too

Regular exercise may benefit the heart in a way scientists are only beginning to understand. Beyond improving cardiovascular fitness, new research suggests that moderate aerobic exercise reshapes the nerves that regulate the heart. The findings could eventually help doctors develop more precise treatments for common heart conditions. Researchers from the University of Bristol (UK) found, for the first time, that regular aerobic training changes the heart's controlling nerves differently on the left and right sides of the body. The study, published in Autonomic Neuroscience, uncovered a striking left-right difference that may one day improve treatment strategies for irregular heartbeats, chest pain, angina, and stress-induced 'broken-heart' syndrome.

Study lead author Augusto Coppi, Senior Lecturer in Veterinary Anatomy at the University of Bristol, said: "The discovery points to a previously hidden left-right pattern in the body's 'autopilot' system that helps run the heart. "These nerve clusters act like

the heart's dimmer switch and we've shown that regular, moderate exercise remodels that switch in a side-specific way. This could help explain why some treatments work better on one side than the other and, in future, help doctors target therapies more precisely and effectively."

The project was carried out in collaboration with University College London (UCL) in the UK, the University of São Paulo (USP), and the Federal University of São Paulo (UNIFESP) in Brazil. Using advanced three-dimensional imaging techniques known as stereology, the team examined how exercise changed nerve clusters that help regulate heart function.

After 10 weeks of training, rats that exercised had about four times as many neurons in the cardiovascular nerve cluster on the right side of the body compared with the left, relative to untrained animals. At the same time, neurons on the left side nearly doubled in size, while those on the right became slightly smaller. These findings suggest that exercise

remodels the heart's nerve network in different ways on each side.

Coppi explained: "Irregular heart rhythms, known as arrhythmias, stress-induced 'broken-heart' syndrome, and certain types of chest pain are often treated by dialing down overactive stellate ganglia - the paired small nerve hubs in the lower neck/upper chest area that send 'go faster' signals to the heart.

"By mapping how exercise changes these ganglia on each side, the study offers clues that could one day fine-tune procedures like nerve blocks or denervation to the side most likely to help. The findings are early-stage and in rats, so clinical studies would need to follow." Although the research is still in its early stages and was conducted in rats, the results raise the possibility that future therapies could be tailored to target one side of these nerve clusters more effectively than the other. That approach could improve treatments for arrhythmias, stress-induced 'broken-heart' syndrome, and difficult-to-treat angina.

The researchers now plan to investigate how these structural changes affect the heart's performance both during exercise and at rest. They also intend to determine whether the same left-right pattern appears in other animal models and in humans using non-invasive markers.

Coppi added: "Understanding these left-right differences could help us personalize treatments for heart rhythm disorders and angina. Our next step is to test how these structural changes map onto function and whether similar patterns appear in larger animals and humans."



Army strengthens civil-military medical collaboration

The Indian Army's Headquarters Dakshin Bharat Area organised a civil-military medical outreach programme in Chennai, bringing together leading doctors from government, private and Ex-service-men Contributory Health Scheme (ECHS)-empanelled hospitals, along with medical specialists from the Army, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard.

The initiative aimed to strengthen cooperation between the Armed Forces and the medical fraternity to enhance preparedness for medical emergencies during both peace and conflict.

The programme commenced at the Victory War Memorial, where General Officer Commanding (GOC), Dakshin Bharat Area, Lt Gen V. Sreehari, highlighted the historical significance of the memorial and paid tribute to the courage and sacrifice of India's Armed Forces. He stressed the importance of closer collaboration between the Armed Forces and the medical community in nation-building.

During an interaction at the HQ Dakshin Bharat Area Officers' Mess, Lt Gen Sreehari underscored the need for coordinated civil-military medical preparedness in light of evolving security challenges. Referring to experiences from the COVID-19 pandemic, humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations, major mass-casualty incidents, Operation SINDOOR and recent global conflicts, he called for regular interaction, coordinated medical protocols and the sharing of expertise.

Heads of leading hospitals in Chennai pledged priority medical care for Defence personnel, support for mock disaster management exercises and sharing of best practices, including inputs for the design of upcoming operation theatres.

The programme concluded with the Light and Sound Show at the Victory War Memorial, showcasing the sacrifices and contributions of the Armed Forces, followed by an interaction with participants.

The outreach is part of HQ Dakshin Bharat Area's continuing efforts to strengthen partnerships with key stakeholders and enhance national resilience and emergency preparedness.

Puducherry Lieutenant Governor K. Kailashnathan virtually inaugurated JIPMER's state-of-the-art Clinical Immunology Laboratory, the only Government healthcare facility in South India offering comprehensive in-house diagnostics and translational research for autoimmune diseases under one roof.

During his visit to the institute, the Lieutenant Governor also reviewed the proposed JIPMER Sedarapet Expansion Project, inspected the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), and participated in a tree plantation drive under the national initiative, "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam."

The Department of Clinical Immunology at JIPMER has been providing specialised care for patients with autoimmune disorders for over two decades and has evolved into one of the country's few centres offering comprehensive clinical services for such complex diseases.

The newly established Clinical Immunology Laboratory is equipped with advanced diagnostic and research infrastructure designed to enhance the diagnosis and treatment of autoimmune disorders. The

facility includes ELISA, Nephelometry and Immunoblot systems for comprehensive autoimmune testing. It also houses a dedicated Cell Imaging Facility with advanced fluorescence and polarising microscopes, along with a sophisticated 16-colour flow cytometer, enabling the diagnosis of rare immune disorders and inborn errors of immunity.

Following the inauguration, Kailashnathan chaired a high-level review meeting on the proposed Sedarapet Expansion Project, attended by senior officials from the Government of Puducherry and JIPMER.

The meeting focused on developing the Sedarapet campus into a major healthcare, medical education and research hub with world-class infrastructure to cater to the growing healthcare needs of the region.

Later, the Lieutenant Governor visited JIPMER's Sewage Treatment Plant, where officials briefed him on the institute's initiatives in wastewater treatment, recycling and sustainable water management as part of its environmental sustainability efforts.

Dementia risk varies from country to country

A new USC led study of more than 214,000 older adults from 14 countries and regions suggests that preventing dementia may require different strategies in different parts of the world. Researchers found that many of the most important modifiable dementia risk factors, including low education, high blood pressure and smoking, vary dramatically between countries. The findings indicate that a single global approach to dementia prevention is unlikely to be effective everywhere.

Most existing research on dementia prevention has come from high income countries, including the United States and nations in Western Europe. To determine whether those findings apply more broadly, researchers from USC worked with colleagues at Brown University and Johns Hopkins University to examine data from both high income and low and middle income countries.

The results revealed major differences, along with some unexpected similarities. For example, low education affected 85.6% of older adults in China but only 12.0% of

those in the United States. High BMI (a measure of excess body weight), on the other hand, was found in 44.9% of Americans compared with just 13.3% of people in India.

Even though individual risk factors differed from country to country, many of them appeared together in similar combinations worldwide. Cardiovascular conditions such as high cholesterol and hypertension frequently clustered together, while behaviours like smoking and drinking also tended to occur as groups.

Lead author Emma Nichols, a research scientist with the Centre for Economic and Social Research at the USC Schaeffer Institute for Public Policy & Government Service, said those shared patterns were among the study's biggest surprises. "I was less surprised by the differences and more surprised by some of the similarities, particularly in the ways these risks are patterned across settings," Nichols said. "That has real implications for how we design prevention strategies and interventions, because some things are more consistent across places than we might expect."

Chennai emerges as advanced heart care capital

Chennai is strengthening its position as one of India's leading centres for advanced structural heart care, with advanced heart valve procedures in the city growing at a steady rate of approximately 30% year-on-year.

The city performs an estimated 400 advanced heart valve procedures annually, with care delivered by experienced multidisciplinary teams offering these specialised services.

Cardiologists attribute this steady growth to increasing clinical confidence supported by long-term evidence and greater awareness among patients about treatment options for severe heart valve disease.

Recent international follow-up data spanning seven years has further strengthened confidence in long-term outcomes, while patients in Chennai are increasingly researching treatment options before making healthcare decisions.

The city's expertise is also attracting patients from beyond South India. Chennai is increasingly

becoming a preferred destination for patients from cities such as Mumbai, Delhi and Kolkata seeking specialised heart valve care, reinforcing its role as a national referral centre for advanced cardiac treatment.

"Symptoms such as breathlessness, fatigue and reduced activity are often mistaken for ageing. Early diagnosis through echocardiography and timely intervention can significantly improve outcomes. Chennai's collaborative heart team approach and growing experience in managing complex heart valve disease are helping improve patient outcomes while giving families greater confidence in treatment decisions," Dr. S. Nagendra Boopathy, Professor of Cardiology, Senior Interventional Cardiologist, Lead - Structural Heart Disease Interventions, Sri Ramachandra Medical Centre (SRMC), at a media round table held here on Tuesday evening.

Doctors, however, cautioned, that access to specialised heart valve

care remains largely concentrated in urban centres. Tamil Nadu is among India's fastest-ageing states and is projected to be the country's oldest by 2031, yet a significant proportion of its elderly population lives outside Chennai, where advanced cardiac evaluation is often unavailable. Symptoms of aortic stenosis are frequently mistaken for normal ageing, delaying diagnosis and limiting timely access to appropriate treatment.

In Chennai's teaching-hospital ecosystem, treatment decisions are made jointly by interventional cardiologists and cardiac surgeons through a multidisciplinary Heart Team approach rather than by a single specialist-a model clinicians say strengthens patient and family confidence. Doctors believe expanding this collaborative model and improving access to specialised cardiac evaluation beyond major cities will be critical to ensuring more patients across Tamil Nadu benefit from timely diagnosis and appropriate treatment, he said.

Ultrasound may stop arthritis before it starts

Researchers at The University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH), part of The University of Alabama System, have identified a promising new use for continuous low-intensity ultrasound that could one day help treat joint injuries and reduce the risk of post-traumatic osteoarthritis. Their findings suggest the non-invasive approach may shift the body's immune response away from long-lasting inflammation and toward tissue repair, offering a potential drug-free strategy for improving healing.

The study, published recently, was led by Anuradha Subramanian, professor of chemical and materials engineering. It combined biological research conducted by Shahid Khan during his doctoral studies with computational and statistical analysis developed by Satyaki Roy, professor of mathematical sciences, along with contributions from graduate student Owen Trippany.

The team focused on macrophages, specialised immune cells that play a key role in both



inflammation and tissue repair, to understand how they respond to continuous low-intensity ultrasound.

"Following injury, the body recruits inflammatory 'defender' macrophages (M1) to clear damaged tissue and healer macrophages (M2) to support repair and recovery. Persistent dominance of defender macrophages can create a prolonged inflammatory environment that contributes to post-traumatic osteoarthritis," Anuradha explains.

The researchers wanted to determine whether ultrasound could encourage these immune cells to transition from an inflammatory state to one that promotes healing.

"In an 'M1' state, microphages promote inflammation to fight damage or infection, but

prolonged M1 activity can also harm healthy tissue.

In contrast, 'M2-like' macrophages support tissue repair and recovery. Shifting macrophages toward an M2-like state is important, because it may help reduce chronic inflammation while encouraging healing in damaged joints. Our

findings suggest that continuous low-intensity ultrasound may help restore this balance by promoting a more reparative macrophage response," Anuradha notes.

Roy says chronic inflammation is a major factor in the development of post-traumatic osteoarthritis.
