# NEW SYNTHETIC TRACKS PROPOSED FOR ITAWA AND RAMGANJ MANDI

*Om Birla Meets Union Sports Minister to Discuss Expansion of Sports Facilities in Kota-Bundi*

New Delhi. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla met Union Youth Affairs and Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya at Parliament House to discuss the expansion of sports facilities and better training opportunities for athletes in the Kota-Bundi region.

During the meeting, Birla proposed the construction of two new synthetic tracks in Itawa and Ramganj Mandi. The Union Minister agreed to the proposal and assured that work in this direction

would be initiated soon. Birla said Kota has immense sporting talent and emphasised the need for modern sports complexes, upgraded facilities, advanced equipment and qualified coaches. He also suggested developing sports grounds at the tehsil level and organising 15-day specialised training camps by leading coaches to provide local athletes with professional guidance.

Mandaviya assured full cooperation from the Centre for strengthening

sports infrastructure in Kota-Bundi and said the government is committed to promoting a strong sports culture and developing world-class facilities across the country. An indoor stadium has already been completed in Ramganj Mandi at a cost of around ₹4.5 crore, while a similar facility is under construction in Itawa. The proposed synthetic tracks are expected to further expand sporting opportunities, particularly for athletes from rural areas.

## ESI Hospital to Get Modern Medical Equipment

During the meeting, Birla also discussed strengthening healthcare facilities at the ESI Hospital in Kota. He urged that vacant posts be filled at the earliest and that the hospital be equipped with modern medical machinery and advanced equipment. He

emphasised that workers should receive quality treatment at the hospital and, when necessary, have access to referrals to higher-level private hospitals for timely and specialised care.

Officials from the Sports Ministry and Birla's office were also present at the meeting.



## 50+ Tour Operators from 11 States See Hadoti Emerging as a Major Tourism Destination

Kota. More than 50 leading tour operators from 11 states, who have been touring major attractions of Kota and Bundi over the past three days, expressed strong appreciation for Hadoti's tourism potential and said the region could emerge as a preferred destination on India's tourism map.

The tour operators said Hadoti offers a unique combination of wildlife sanctuaries, the Chambal River, historical monuments, archaeological heritage, natural beauty and modern attractions. They noted that despite having such diverse tourism offerings, the region has not yet received the national and international promotion it deserves.

The operators assured that they would promote Hadoti among domestic and international travellers and explore opportunities to include the region in itineraries of major Rajasthan tourism circuits.

Rajasthan President Hussain Khan said efforts have been underway for the past two years to establish Hadoti on the national tourism map. He said the familiarisation tour organised by the Kota Division of the federation is expected to prove a milestone in the region's tourism development.

Khan said efforts would also be made to connect Hadoti with major tourism circuits covering Jaipur, Ajmer and Pushkar,

while promoting combined Mewar-Hadoti tourism packages. He emphasised that tour operators play a crucial role in expanding tourist footfall and that their positive feedback has strengthened the region's tourism campaign.

Hotel Federation of Rajasthan, Kota Division President Ashok Maheshwari said the response from tour operators during the FAM tour has been encouraging. The visitors explored

attractions including Chambal Safari, Garh Palace, Abhedha Mahal, City Park, Seven Wonders Park and Kishore Sagar Lake. The tour operators were particularly impressed by the Chambal Safari, describing it as a unique experience. They also visited hotels and resorts in Kota and appreciated the hospitality and facilities available in the city. Maheshwari said attractions such as Mukundra Hills Tiger

Reserve, Chambal Safari, Chambal River Front and Ramgarh Vishdhari Wildlife Sanctuary can play a major role in developing Hadoti as a leading tourism destination.

The visiting tour operators praised Hadoti's scenic beauty, food, hospitality and natural environment. They said they would explore developing tourism packages to bring more visitors to the region. They also viewed Kota as a promising and cost-effective destination for destination weddings, citing competitive hotel and resort prices compared with other major tourism cities.

A B2B meeting of the participating tour operators is scheduled for Saturday morning, followed by a jungle safari at Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserve. Discussions will focus on developing Hadoti tourism packages and strategies to connect more domestic and international tourists with the region.

## Kota Emerging as a Centre for Advanced Ophthalmic Training

*More than 40 Young Ophthalmologists Trained at SuVi Eye Hospital*

Kota. SuVi Eye Hospital and LASIK Laser Centre, Kota, organised a ceremony to mark the completion of the Medical Retina Fellowship, presentation of a training certificate and welcome of a new fellow.

Senior physician and former API President Dr. K. K. Pareek was the chief guest, while Dr. Deepak Kumar Shrivastava, Divisional Librarian and Head of Government Divisional Public Library, Kota, was the guest of honour. Dr. Himanshi Bhardwaj was felicitated after completing her Medical Retina Fellowship, while Dr. Lalitha Manasa from Ongole, Andhra Pradesh, began her

fellowship training. Dr. K. K. Pareek emphasised that continuous learning, practical training, ethics and compassion are essential qualities of a successful doctor. Dr. Deepak Kumar Shrivastava said specialised fellowship programmes help young doctors gain scientific knowledge and practical skills in managing complex diseases.

SuVi Eye Hospital Director and senior ophthalmic surgeon Dr. Suresh Kumar Pandey, along with retina specialist Dr. Nipun Bagrecha, said the fellowship provides hands-on training in advanced retinal examination, OCT, FFA, anti-VEGF injections, retinal laser procedures and

comprehensive patient management. The programme focuses on conditions including diabetic retinopathy, diabetic macular oedema, age-related macular degeneration, retinal vein occlusion and retinal tears.

Dr. Nipun Bagrecha said ophthalmologists from different parts of India are travelling to Kota for specialised ophthalmic training, giving the city a growing identity as a centre for medical education alongside its reputation as "Shiksha Ki Kaashi."

More than 40 young ophthalmologists from across India have so far received training in Medical Retina and other ophthalmic subspecialties at SuVi Eye Hospital.

## Prioritise Unaddressed Needs Before Planning Projects: Collector “RUIDP Samvad” Workshop Held to Discuss Phase-V Development Works in Kota

Kota. A stakeholder consultation workshop under the Rajasthan Urban Infrastructure Development Project (RUIDP) “Samvad” was held at the Collectorate auditorium under the chairmanship of District Collector Piyush Samaria. The meeting discussed proposed works for Kota and other cities in the district under Phase-V of the project.

The Collector directed officials to prioritise works that could not be completed under previous projects and focus on areas where infrastructure gaps remain. He stressed close coordination between the district administration and concerned departments before finalising the

Detailed Project Report (DPR).

Samaria specifically called for a comprehensive solution to the problem of untreated sewage entering the Chambal River. He suggested studying treatment and other alternatives before preparing the action plan. He also called for modern and quality shelters under urban mobility, systematic development and maintenance of heritage sites, and need-based planning for flood management, drainage, wastewater and solid waste management.

Municipal Commissioner Om Prakash Mehra and other officials presented details of areas left uncovered under previous projects and

shared suggestions. Representatives from various departments, civic organisations, media and other stakeholders also participated.

₹945.45 Crore Works Proposed for Kota District Under Phase-V of RUIDP, development works worth ₹945.45 crore are proposed across Kota district, including ₹927.27 crore for Kota city. Sangod, Ramganj Mandi and Kaithoon have also been included in the phase.

According to RUIDP Assistant Engineer Kush Kumar, proposed works include ₹394.15 crore for wastewater management and ₹57.55 crore for flood management. Urban mobility works worth ₹299.17 crore and solid waste management works

worth ₹105.76 crore are proposed for Kota.

Works related to command and control centres, heritage and tourism are also planned across Kota, Sangod, Ramganj Mandi and Kaithoon. 84 Cities to Be Covered Across Rajasthan

The state government is preparing to begin Phase-V works in 84 cities across Rajasthan, with an estimated investment of around ₹9,500 crore. The phase will focus on wastewater and solid waste management, urban transport, flood management and drainage, heritage conservation, tourism development, and command and control centres to make cities smarter and more sustainable.

## ₹4.25 Crore RU IDP Phase-V Works Discussed with Stakeholders in Sangod

Kota. A consultation meeting under the Rajasthan Urban Infrastructure Development Project (RUIDP) “Samvad” was held at the Panchayat Samiti auditorium in Sangod to discuss development works proposed under Phase-V of the project.

The meeting brought together elected representatives, prominent citizens, officials from various departments and other stakeholders. RUIDP officials provided details of works worth ₹4.25 crore proposed for Sangod under the fifth phase.

The phase, funded by the Asian Development Bank, will focus on flood management and drainage, a command and control centre, heritage conservation and tourism-related works, and solid waste management. Urban mobility solutions will also be introduced to improve the city's transport network and provide a more efficient and sustainable system.

RUIDP Assistant Engineer Kush Kumar gave a detailed presentation on the proposed works and also showcased a



documentary highlighting the projects being undertaken by RUIDP.

Sangod Pradhan Jaiveer Singh thanked the state government for the project and stressed the need for coordination between RUIDP, the municipality and other departments. He assured that the people of Sangod and ward councillors would extend full cooperation for successful implementation of the project.

Sangod Deputy Pradhan Om Prakash Nagar, along with public representatives, officials, prominent citizens and other stakeholders, participated in the consultation.

## CBN Rajasthan Unit Seizes 211 Grams of Illegal MD, Motorcycle; One Arrested

Kota. The Central Bureau of Narcotics (CBN), Rajasthan Unit, seized 0.211 kg (211 grams) of illegal MD and a motorcycle during an operation on the Mandsaur-Sitamau road in Madhya Pradesh. One person was arrested in connection with the case.

Acting on specific intelligence regarding the transportation of illegal MD on a black Super Splendor motorcycle, a team of CBN, Kota Division, was deployed for surveillance. On August 5, officials intercepted the suspected motorcycle near Arania Nizamuddin village on the Mandsaur-Sitamau route.

During the search, officials recovered a plastic bag concealed inside the motorcycle's front visor. The bag contained approximately 211 grams of illegal MD. After completing the required legal formalities, the contraband and the motorcycle allegedly used for its transportation were seized. The accused was arrested under relevant provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985. Further investigation and legal proceedings are underway. The CBN said the action was part of the government's Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan and its zero-tolerance approach towards drug trafficking. The agency stated that its efforts are aimed not only at seizing narcotics but also at dismantling illegal trafficking networks and drug cartels.
