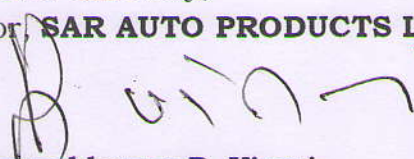

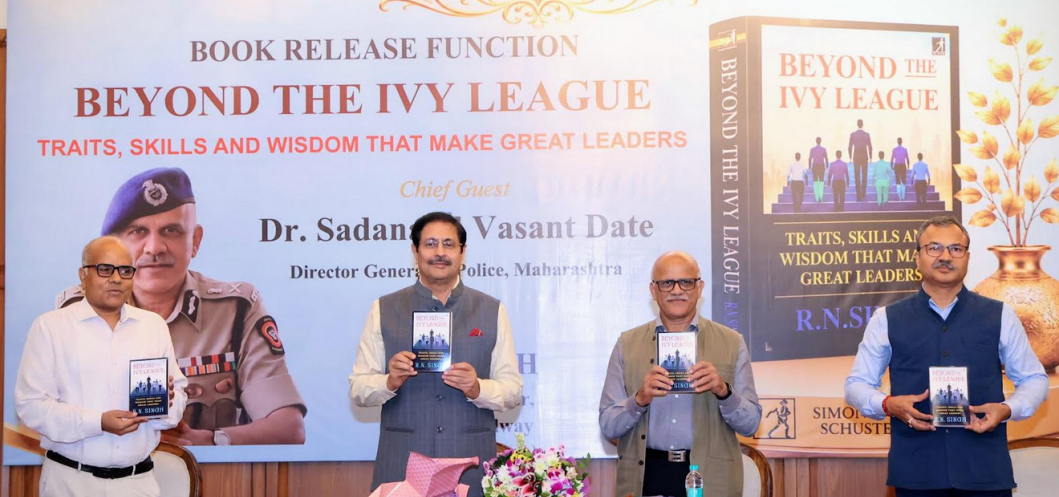

Ahmedabad, Shri R.N. Laborer kills friend by beating him with a paddle in Anand Fruit Market

Anand, A fight over labor at a fruit market opposite the railway station in Anand city turned deadly. While the fruit was being unloaded, a man attacked his friend with a paddle and killed him in a dispute over "why haven't I been brought in for labor work today," creating panic in the entire area. Friend killed by 3 to 4 blows with a chopstick According to the information

received, Ramesh Balakbhai Gosai was unloading in the fruit market with his four other colleagues in the afternoon. Meanwhile, Kantibhai Desaihbhai Thakor reached there and had an argument and fight with Rameshbhai over not being called for work. As the argument became fierce, Kantibhai hit Rameshbhai 3 to 4 blows with the chopstick he had. Rameshbhai died on the

spot due to serious injuries. Police sent the body for postmortem. As soon as the incident was reported, the PI, PSI of Anand Town Police Station and the police staff immediately rushed to the spot. The police completed the on-site investigation and sent the body to the hospital for postmortem and have started an investigation into the entire incident.

Revenue of Rs 1208 crores will be generated Proposal to sell 16 plots in areas including Sola, Jagatpur and Ranip



Ahmedabad Residential and commercial plots are being sold to increase the income of the Municipal Corporation to provide infrastructure facilities to the citizens and to further develop the development works.

The proposal to sell the 16 plots reserved for the Municipal Corporation will be taken up in the meeting of the Standing Committee to be held today.

The sale of this plot will generate revenue of Rs 1208 crore for the corporation, which will be spent on various works including basic amenities for the citizens.

Valuation of a total of 20 plots of the corporation has been put up for discussion and consideration. According to the information received, an important meeting of the Price Fixing Committee formed by the Ahmedabad Urban Development Authority (AUDA) was held on June 12. In this meeting, the valuation of a total of 20 plots of the corporation was put up for discussion and consideration. Out of which, the committee finalized and approved the floor prices of 16 plots, while it was decided to postpone the valuation of the remaining 4 plots for the time being.

The plots put up for sale by the Municipal Corporation are estimated to collect over

Rs 296 crore in the corporation's coffers and are located in developed and posh areas like Ambli, Gota, Sola, Jagatpur, Thaltej and Ranip in the western part of the city. Apart from this, there is also a very important plot in Hanspura area in the north zone. The largest plot among all these plots is plot number 96 of TP 109 (Muthia-Hanspura-Bilasila).

The offset price of this huge plot of 41,843 sq m for residential purposes has been fixed at Rs. 71,000 per sq m. The sale of this single plot alone is estimated to bring in over Rs. 296 crore to the corporation's coffers.

Primary facilities will be created in different areas

The money received by the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation from the sale of commercial and residential plots received under the TP scheme will be used to create primary facilities in different areas of the city.

After the approval of the Standing Committee, modern infrastructure facilities like drinking water, sewage system, paved roads, street lights, storm water (rainwater) lines, beautiful gardens, public library, civic center and fire station will be developed from this fund for the citizens. The price per sq m of TP 56 plot has been kept at the highest at 2.10 lakhs

Heavy rain for 6 days for Gujarat, 4 systems active simultaneously

Orange alert for heavy rain in 7 districts including Surat today; All departments ordered to remain alert with equipment and teams

Ahmedabad With four rain systems activating simultaneously in Gujarat, the rainy weather will resume from July 30 today. Heavy to very heavy rain has been predicted for the next 6 days. Heavy rain may fall in the districts of North Gujarat, Central Gujarat and South Gujarat. The Meteorological Department has issued an orange alert in 7 districts including Surat today (July 30). On July 31, a red alert of extremely heavy rain has been issued in 8 districts including Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat.

In the last 24 hours, 50 talukas have received rainfall ranging from 1 mm to one and a half inches. The highest rainfall was recorded in Sanjeli of Dahod at 1.38 inches, Singwad at 1.06 and Lunavada of Mahisagar also received one inch. Due to the heavy rains in the upper reaches of Dholera Panthak, only water is seen everywhere.



'Weather Watch Group' meeting in Gandhinagar, administration on high alert A 'Weather Watch Group' meeting was held at the State Emergency Operation Center (SEOC) in Gandhinagar under the chairmanship of Relief Commissioner Gaurang Makwana. A comprehensive review of the preparations of the administration for the rainy situation and disaster management in the state was made in this meeting. The Relief Commissioner ordered all the integrated departments to be in immediate action mode by mapping equipment and teams, the Roads and Housing Department to remove dilapidated houses and hoardings and to take

extra care by delivering disaster messages to the lower class people living in mud houses and slums in a timely manner.

During a review meeting of the uneven rainfall pattern and flood relief operations in the state, the Relief Commissioner said that the state is witnessing an uneven rainfall pattern, where Valsad-Navsari has recorded 100 percent rainfall and Dholka has received an unprecedented rainfall of 20 inches in a short period of time. Keeping this in mind, all the collectors and disaster management teams have been put on high alert. With the coordination of security forces, more than 53,600 citizens have been shifted to safer places in South Gujarat before the flood situation and more than 9,600 people trapped in the flood waters have been successfully rescued.

Four systems active simultaneously, extremely heavy rain forecast and red alert in Gujarat

Currently, four rain systems are active simultaneously in the state, including 1. Deep Depression, 2. Monsoon Trough, 3. Upper Air Cyclonic Circulation and 4.

Western Disturbance. Due to this system, the intensity of rain will increase from today. The rain system has also become strong due to the effect of the Deep Depression. Today (July 30) there is a forecast of extremely heavy rain at scattered places in various districts of South Gujarat and Central Gujarat, while on July 31, a red alert has been issued in Ahmedabad, Anand, Vadodara, Bharuch, Narmada, Surat, Tapi and Dang districts with a warning of extremely heavy rain. In addition, on August 1, a possibility of torrential rain with an orange alert has been expressed in North Gujarat.

Warning for fishermen for two days

According to Meteorological Department Director Dr. A.K Das, a thunderstorm warning has been issued in the state till August 1. The wind direction in the sea area will be towards the southwest direction and due to the sharp pressure gradient, there will be strong wind conditions, in which the wind speed will be 20 to 25 knots. A warning has been issued for fishermen till August 1 due to the possibility of strong winds.

Ahmedabad plane crash: There was no fault in the fuel switch

Government told Parliament; Earlier it was claimed that this was the reason why the engines stopped



Ahmedabad The reason for the Ahmedabad plane crash was not a fault in the fuel control switch. This information was given by the government in the Rajya Sabha on Wednesday. The government said that even in the advanced tests of the aircraft manufacturer, no fault was found in this system.

However, the AAIB's preliminary investigation report released last year claimed that the fuel control switches on both engines had been turned off shortly after takeoff, causing both engines to shut down.

Last year, on June 12, 2025, the AI-171 flight bound for London crashed into the BJ Medical College hostel in Meghaninagar. 241 passengers and 19 people on the ground died in the accident. Only one passenger survived.

The government refused due to the delay in the final report.

The government also clarified that there was no delay in releasing the investigation report into the plane crash. This question was actually asked by Rajya Sabha MP JB Mather Hisham.

Hisham asked - why has the final report not been made public even after more than a year of the accident, is the role of the pilots also being looked into in the investigation, and when will the report be made public.

On this, the government said that the investigation of such major aircraft accidents cannot be completed within a fixed time frame. The investigation depends on many technical aspects and constantly changing conditions. The final report will be made public after the investigation is completed.

Now read about the Ahmedabad plane crash

On 12 June 2025, Flight AI 171 from Ahmedabad to London crashed into a medical hotel building shortly after takeoff. 270 people died, including 241 passengers and crew members. Only one passenger survived the accident.

According to FlightRadar24, the plane's last signal was received at an altitude of 190 meters (625 feet), which came shortly after takeoff.

India's civil aviation regulator DGCA said that the plane took off from runway 23 at 1:39 pm on June 12. After taking off, the pilot of the plane sent a Mayday call (emergency message) to the air traffic controller, but there was no response after that.

According to the DGCA, there were a total of 242 people on board the plane, including two pilots and 10 cabin crew.

After the Air India plane crashed into the 'Atulyam Hostel' building in the Meghaninagar area of Ahmedabad on June 12, 2025 at 1:38 pm, the state government has made a major relief announcement for doctors and PG students.

A new state-of-the-art super specialty hostel and canteen block will now be built at a cost of ?105 crore in the New Mental Campus near the Civil Hospital in Asarwar.

'We are traders, not beggars...give us a loan, we will pay it in installments'

Shop owners are dissatisfied with the announcement of assistance, saying - they have not received assistance despite filling the form 25 years ago

Ahmedabad The heavy rains in Ahmedabad have dealt a heavy financial blow to many families and traders. The Indraprastha Tower on the driving road was filled with four to five feet of rainwater, damaging the goods, furniture, electronics and important documents kept in the shops. The traders, who have suffered losses worth lakhs of rupees, are now not satisfied even with the aid announced by the government. The traders say that the aid announced is very little compared to the losses. Shop owners have demanded loans to rebuild their businesses, not mercy.

Shop owners say that we are traders, not beggars. If the government cannot provide direct assistance, then it can provide interest-free or easy-to-pay loans, and we will pay them in installments. But we need an opportunity to rebuild our business, not charity.

In 2001, the shops of Indraprastha Tower were submerged.

Due to heavy rains, water entered the Indraprastha Tower from the roads. About 25 years ago, a similar situation occurred at the same place. So, after 25 years, the shops were submerged in water again due to heavy rains. The shop owners did not even get time to move the goods kept in the shops to the place. Due to which more than 20 shops were submerged in water. All the goods kept in the shops, including electrical items, got soaked. Due to which the shop owners have had to bear losses worth lakhs of rupees. Also, whatever things got soaked had to be thrown away as they could not be used again.

Since the corporation did not make arrangements for

water disposal, the shop owners brought a pump at their own expense to drain the water and get it cleaned. Due to this, the business of all the shop owners has come to a standstill for the last one week. The shop owners are alleging that not a single official from the corporation or the government has come to the spot to check on their condition after the waterlogging.

Prakashbhai Gohil, a cloth shop owner said, "Our shops were flooded with four feet of water. I have lost about 18 to 20 lakh rupees. I have had a sad experience with the government before. 25 years ago, in 2001, our shops were flooded in the same way. At that time too, I suffered a lot. At that time too, we people had filled forms for assistance. I had suffered a loss of about 2 lakh rupees. Despite filling the forms, there is still no sign of assistance. So, how can we trust the government?" is a big question.

Further, Prakashbhai Gohil said that even at that time, a form was filled for the damage and two lakh rupees were written for assistance. But even after 25 years, not a single rupee of assistance has been received. This time too, assistance has been announced but how much it reaches the ground level is important.

I have suffered a loss of Rs 8 to 10 lakh due to waterlogging'

Stationary shop owner Nisarg Modi said that I have suffered a loss of Rs 8 to 10 lakh due to waterlogging. The color machine and Xerox machine have broken down due to waterlogging. Right now, they have been opened and kept for drying. But the chances of them getting started again are very low.

Even if they get started, they will not be able to run for a long time. So there will be a situation where new machines will have to be bought in two months. The government has announced assistance but if it is received, it is considered true. The announcement is made. But nothing reaches the traders. Our demand is that arrangements should be made so that assistance is received as soon as possible.

All electrical items including computers have been damaged: Trader

Shop owner Rajeshbhai Chaudhary said, "My shop was filled with five feet of water. Due to which both the machines have broken down. All the electrical items including the computer have broken down. If we go to buy a new machine, its cost is Rs 4 lakh per machine. So I have lost about Rs 10 lakh. So we request the government to announce the assistance and get it as soon as possible so that we can start the business again. We demand that the officials conduct a survey in person and announce the assistance. We are not getting enough assistance as announced. Right now, after paying the house rent and shop rent, nothing comes in hand. There has been no income for a week.

Started business about eight months ago by renting a shop: Tejasbhai, the owner of a food shop, said that he started business about eight months ago by renting a shop. But due to rainwater ingress, all the raw material got soaked. Which is now of no use. Food items worth about two lakh rupees have spoiled and had to be thrown away. Also, the fridge was also shut down due to waterlogging. I have suffered a loss of about three lakh rupees.
