SIEMA backs budget's focus on infra, renewable energy

Coimbatore, Aug. 6: The Southern India Engineering Manufacturers' Association (SIEMA) has welcomed several key announcements in the Tamil Nadu Budget 2026-27, stating that the Government's continued focus on infrastructure, industrial development and renewable energy will strengthen the State's manufacturing ecosystem and provide fresh opportunities for engineering industries.

In a statement issued, SIEMA President Mithun Ramdas said the enhanced allocation of Rs. 29,863 crore for the Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department, up from Rs. 26,678 crore in the previous Budget, is a significant step towards improving urban infrastructure and public services.

He said sustained investments in drinking water supply, sewerage and urban water infrastructure would not only enhance the quality of life but also create substantial business opportunities for engineering manufacturers producing pumps, motors, valves and related equipment.

The association also welcomed the Government's continued thrust on renewable energy and rooftop solar power, describing Tamil Nadu as a frontrunner in clean energy adoption. SIEMA noted that the increase in the rooftop solar subsidy



from Rs. 78,000 to Rs. 1 lakh would encourage greater adoption of rooftop solar systems across the State.

Highlighting the importance of reliable electricity for industries, particularly micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), the association said investments aimed at strengthening the power sector would improve industrial productivity and enhance the competitiveness of manufacturing units.

SIEMA further appreciated the Government's long-term vision of transforming Tamil Nadu into a US\$1.5 trillion economy through sustained industrial growth and infrastructure development.

The association expressed confidence that the policy direction outlined in the Budget would continue to attract investments,

generate employment and reinforce Tamil Nadu's position as one of India's leading manufacturing destinations.

From the perspective of MSMEs, SIEMA said the emphasis on infrastructure, power and industrial development would directly benefit thousands of small and medium engineering enterprises that form the backbone of the State's manufacturing sector, enabling them to become more competitive in both domestic and international markets.

However, the association also expressed disappointment over the absence of certain long-pending industry demands in the Budget. SIEMA noted that there was no announcement on recognising the pump industry as a thrust sector, a demand it has consistently raised with the Government. It also pointed out that the Budget did not address the issue of removing fixed electricity charges for MSMEs, another longstanding demand of the association.

The association said it hopes the Government will consider these proposals in the coming months and expressed optimism about the forthcoming Agriculture Budget and departmental policy announcements, particularly those relating to irrigation, water resource development, solar-powered pumping systems and additional support measures for MSMEs.



Rao Hospital organises breastfeeding awareness session for expectant, new mothers

Coimbatore, Aug. 6: Rao Hospital, a leading women and children's healthcare institution in Coimbatore, organised a "Breastfeeding & Beyond" Awareness Programme to educate expectant mothers, new mothers and their families on breastfeeding, newborn nutrition and infant feeding practices.

The programme, held at the hospital in R.S. Puram, was organised in association with FICCI FLO Coimbatore, Rotary Club of Coimbatore Akurthi, and the Inner Wheel Club of Coimbatore. The initiative aimed to raise awareness about the importance of breastfeeding while equipping mothers with practical knowledge to confidently care for their newborns during the early stages of motherhood.

The event featured expert sessions by Dr. K.S. Krishnasamy, Senior Neonatologist and Paediatrician, and Baby Shree, Lactation Consultant and Child Nutrition Expert, who addressed common concerns related to breastfeeding, maternal nutrition, newborn feeding patterns and the timely introduction of complementary foods.

During an interactive session, Baby Shree demonstrated proper breastfeeding techniques, including correct latch, feeding positions, maintaining milk supply and overcoming common breastfeeding challenges.

She also conducted a special session on introducing solid foods, explaining when and how complementary feeding should begin while continuing breastfeeding. She stressed that breastfeeding is not only about providing nutrition but also about strengthening the emotional bond between mother and child, adding that timely introduction of complementary foods is essential for healthy growth and development.

The experts also shared practical tips for successful breastfeeding, including initiating breastfeeding immediately after birth, feeding babies on demand, ensuring proper positioning and latch, avoiding formula feeding unless medically advised, maintaining adequate hydration and nutrition, and seeking professional support whenever needed.

As part of the awareness programme, Dr. B. Suganya Kathir, Senior Consultant in Fertility and Obstetrics & Gynaecology, delivered a session on postnatal cervical cancer prevention, highlighting the benefits of HPV vaccination after childbirth and encouraging women to prioritise preventive healthcare alongside motherhood.

The programme witnessed enthusiastic participation from expectant and new mothers, who actively interacted with the experts, clarified their doubts and gained practical insights into breastfeeding and infant nutrition. Participants also received specially curated gift hampers as a token of appreciation.

Hospital authorities said the initiative reflects Rao Hospital's continued commitment to promoting maternal and child health by empowering parents with the knowledge and confidence needed to provide the best possible start for their children.

CODISSIA praises TN budget for industry-friendly, future-ready initiatives

Coimbatore, Aug. 6: The Coimbatore District Small Industries Association (CODISSIA) has welcomed the Tamil Nadu Budget 2026-27 presented by Finance Minister N. Marie Wilson, describing it as a growth-oriented budget that lays a strong foundation for industrial development, innovation, skill enhancement and infrastructure expansion across the State.

In a statement issued, CODISSIA President V. Rangaswamy appreciated several key announcements in the budget, stating that they would significantly strengthen Tamil Nadu's manufacturing ecosystem and improve the ease of doing business.

Among the major announcements welcomed by the association is the Rs. 2,142 crore allocation for the MSME Department, which is expected to provide a major boost to the State's micro, small and medium enterprises.

CODISSIA also praised the proposed TN Single Window 3.0, which aims to provide faster and more efficient approvals for industries, thereby reducing procedural delays and improving the investment climate.

The association further welcomed the Rs. 3,200 crore allocation for the establishment of new SIPCOT industrial parks and the announcement of a new Industrial Policy focused on advanced manufacturing and deep technology. It also appreciated the Rs. 4,000



crore allocation for the Coimbatore-Ariyalur grid distribution project, which is expected to strengthen industrial infrastructure and power distribution.

Among the other major initiatives highlighted by CODISSIA were the establishment of five new Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) at an estimated cost of Rs. 90 crore, the creation of 20,000 new electric vehicle charging stations, and specialised training programmes for mechanics in electric vehicle and battery maintenance.

The association also welcomed the proposed Space Industrial Investment Zone in southern Tamil Nadu and the establishment of Multi-Modal Logistics Parks, stating that these initiatives would improve industrial connectivity and attract fresh investments.

Describing artificial intelligence as a key driver of future economic growth, CODISSIA lauded the

proposal to establish 'Avanagam'—an AI and Innovation City, which will bring together AI companies, startups, Global Capability Centres (GCCs) and research institutions working in artificial intelligence, quantum technology and advanced computing.

The association also appreciated the government's emphasis on skill development through the launch of the 'Vetri Skill Training Scheme', internship programmes in collaboration with government and private industries, and the expansion of the Tamil Nadu School Programme for Artificial Intelligence, Robotics and Knowledge of Online Tools (TN SPARK) from 5,000 schools to an additional 2,600 schools during 2026-27.

CODISSIA further welcomed the introduction of a structured curriculum on emerging technologies for school students and the launch of the AI Industry Development Programme, saying these initiatives would help position Tamil Nadu as a national leader in artificial intelligence, innovation and advanced manufacturing.

Expressing confidence in the State's industrial future, V. Rangaswamy said the Budget reflects the government's commitment to creating a globally competitive industrial ecosystem while promoting entrepreneurship, employment generation and technology-driven growth across Tamil Nadu.

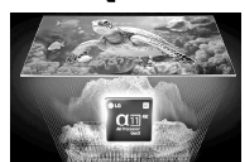
