Mobile toilets installed in Thideer Nagar

Chennai,Aug 4: The State government initiated the installation of mobile toilets and other basic amenities at Thideer Nagar along the Adyar river in Saidapet following long-standing complaints from residents over the lack of sanitation facilities.

The action was taken on the directions of Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay after Rural Development and Water Resources Minister N. Anand inspected the settlement beneath the Maraimalai Adigal Bridge in Greater Chennai Corporation's Ward 142. Residents had repeatedly raised concerns over poor sanitation and the

absence of toilets in the locality. The issue was brought to the Minister's attention by Saidapet MLA M. Arul Prakasam.

During the inspection, the Minister interacted with residents and assured them that desilting of the Adyar river would be carried out before the northeast monsoon to improve flood preparedness.He also directed officials to immediately provide essential civic amenities, including toilet facilities, for the residents.

Following the inspection, work to install mobile toilets and other basic infrastructure began on Monday itself.

ITI admissions extended till Aug 14

Tiruvannamalai,Aug 4: Direct admissions to fill 69 vacant seats at the Government Industrial Training Institute (ITI) in Tiruvannamalai have been extended until August 14, offering eligible candidates another opportunity to enrol in skill-development courses for the 2026-27 academic year.

Of the institute's sanctioned intake of 416 seats, 347 were filled during the counselling and direct admission process held between June 8 and July 31. The remaining seats are available in four trades — Manufacturing Process Control and Automation (33 seats), Turner (18), Basic Designer and Virtual Verifier (Mechanical) (9), and Industrial Robotics and Digital Manufacturing Technician (9).

Candidates who have passed Class 10 are eligible to apply. Women aged 14 years and above can apply without an upper age limit, while male applicants must be between 14 and 40 years of age.

Applicants should submit their Class 10 marksheet, transfer certificate, community certificate, Aadhaar card, passport-size photographs and the application fee of Rs 50 directly at the Government ITI in Tiruvannamalai.

Collector Vandana Garg said the institute offers industry-oriented training and apprenticeship opportunities in leading companies. Successful trainees are expected to secure placements with a starting monthly salary of at least Rs 20,000.

Students admitted to the courses will receive free textbooks, drawing instruments, uniforms, bicycles, footwear and bus passes from the government. All trainees are also eligible for a monthly stipend of Rs 750. In addition, students who studied from Classes 6 to 12 in government or government-aided schools can avail a monthly assistance of Rs 1,000 under the Tamil Pudhalvan and Pudhumaipen schemes during the training period.

TNEA second-round counselling begins

Chennai, Aug. 4: The second round of Tamil Nadu Engineering Admissions (TNEA) counselling began, with 93,116 candidates, including 15,465 government school students under the 7.5 per cent reservation, eligible to participate in the online choice-filling process until August 5. Candidates with cut-off marks ranging from 171 to 135.75 can exercise their college preferences through the official TNEA portal until 5 p.m. on August 5, according to the Tamil Nadu Engineering Admissions Committee.

The provisional allotment list will be released on August 7, and candidates must confirm their allotted seats by 5 p.m. on August 8. Final allotment orders, along with provisional allotment orders for candidates opting for upward movement, will be issued on August 9.

Candidates allotted seats must complete the admission process at their respective colleges, while those opting for upward movement should report to facilitation centres by August 13.

Revised allotment orders for candidates seeking upward movement will be released on August 17, when the third round of counselling, covering 1,02,718 candidates, is scheduled to begin.

This year, 418 engineering colleges across Tamil Nadu are offering 2,53,806 approved seats, of which 1,99,775 government quota seats are being filled through TNEA.

A total of 2,36,017 candidates feature in this year's engineering rank list. So far, 950 seats have been allotted under special category counselling, while 28,979 seats were filled in the first round of general counselling.

TN moves SC on water release

Chennai, August 4: The Tamil Nadu government moved the Supreme Court seeking directions to Karnataka to release 26.954 tmc ft of Cauvery water, alleging that the neighbouring State had failed to comply with the Cauvery Water Management Authority (CWMA) and Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) orders.

The petition was filed after Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay directed the State to seek legal intervention, contending that Karnataka had not released Tamil Nadu's due share despite adequate storage in its reservoirs.The CWRC, at its 139th

meeting on July 28, had directed Karnataka to ensure a release of 3,500 cusecs at Biligundlu for 15 days from July 29 to August 12. The direction was subsequently endorsed by the CWMA at its emergency meeting on July 30.

However, Tamil Nadu said the actual inflow at Biligundlu between July 29 and August 2 ranged only between 158 and 550 cusecs, far below the quantity ordered.

The State also pointed out that, as of August 3, Karnataka's four major Cauvery basin reservoirs - Krishnaraja Sagar, Kabini, Harangi and Hemavathi - together held

77.537 tmc ft of water, including 67.517 tmc ft of utilisable storage, arguing that there was no difficulty in releasing Tamil Nadu's share.

Tamil Nadu further stated that heavy rainfall in the catchment areas had increased inflows, and based on the proportional sharing formula, it was entitled to 26.954 tmc ft of water. It contended that the 4.536 tmc ft directed by the CWMA was itself lower than the State's due share.

The State has sought appropriate directions from the Supreme Court to ensure timely release of its allocated share of Cauvery water.

Cauvery water reaches TN

Dharmapuri, Aug 4: Cauvery water released from Karnataka's Kabini dam reached the Tamil Nadu border at Biligundlu early on Tuesday, raising hopes among farmers after weeks of uncertainty over water release for irrigation.

The inflow at Biligundlu increased from 500 cusecs on Monday evening to 1,000 cusecs on Tuesday morning and is expected to rise further in the coming days as more surplus water flows downstream.

Karnataka began releasing surplus water from the Kabini dam on August 1 following heavy southwest monsoon rains in the catchment areas. The discharge was initially 5,000 cusecs, later

increased to 10,000 cusecs and subsequently to 25,000 cusecs on Saturday night.

Officials said the volume of water reaching Tamil Nadu could increase further if Karnataka also releases surplus water from the Krishnaraja Sagar (KRS) dam.

Tamil Nadu had not received its customary June 12 release this year after Karnataka cited inadequate rainfall in the Cauvery basin. The delay had affected irrigation prospects in the delta districts, where farmers have been awaiting water for cultivation.

The arrival of Cauvery water at Biligundlu has brought relief to farmers, who hope the increased inflow will improve irrigation conditions in the Cauvery delta.

Collector warns tough action against drug peddlers

Villupuram, Aug. 4: Rahman warned of stringent action against those involved in the sale of banned narcotic substances and directed officials to intensify enforcement, particularly around educational institutions and other crowded public places.

Chairing a district-level review meeting on law and order, road safety and drug prevention at the Collectorate, he instructed the police, food safety and health departments to conduct coordinated inspections and strengthen surveillance to curb the sale of narcotics.

The Collector also directed officials from the Regional Transport Office, police and highways department to jointly inspect accident-prone stretches across the district and recommend measures to reduce road accidents.

He asked authorities to ensure that speed breakers are provided wherever required and that thermoplastic road markings are properly laid and maintained to improve road safety.

The meeting also stressed the need for coordinated efforts to maintain law and order while creating greater public awareness on drug abuse and road safety.

Superintendent of Police Madhivanan and senior government officials attended the meeting.
