Iranian-backed Houthi rebels renew attacks on Yemen

Iranian-backed Houthi rebels renewed their attacks Tuesday on Government-controlled areas in Yemen as ongoing violence threatened to reignite the country's civil war and raised fears over new threats to shipping lanes.

Iran's foreign minister, meanwhile, underscored Tehran's stance against reopening the Strait of Hormuz until the US meets its conditions, in comments that came after US President Donald Trump said he was now demanding compensation from Iran "for all of the people that they have killed" in the past.

Houthis hit targets in central Yemen

Iranian-backed Houthi rebels in Yemen attacked the Government-



held port city of Mokha on the Red Sea coast and other areas of the country, deepening fears over threats to strategic shipping routes and a potential return to civil war.

Yemen's military said the rebels targeted both Mokha and the central province of Marib with missiles and drones but did not provide further details.

The Houthis struck Marib and the eastern province of Hadramout last week, killing dozens of Government troops and civilians. They hit Mokha with missiles and drones over the weekend and killed at least seven people, including three troops, according to the Yemeni military.

Mokha is a main port under Yemen's internationally recog-

nized Government and has been renovated to handle shipping to avoid the Houthi-held port of Hodeida.

The strikes came as part of a recent escalation by the Houthis against Government forces in Yemen and oil facilities in neighboring Saudi Arabia, which supports the internationally recognised Yemeni Government, and the kingdom's shipping in the Red Sea. With the Strait of Hormuz effectively shut down by Iran, there has been a renewed focus on the Red Sea and Bab el-Mandeb Strait as Yemen's southern route, which is an alternate route for Saudi Arabia to ship its oil to open oceans. The Houthi attacks could reignite Yemen's civil war after a four-year hiatus following a 2022 truce, and open a new front in the Middle East war.

Iranian FM underline's Tehran's demands

Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi told reporters in Iran that the country had "astounded the whole world" in the war against the United States and Israel, proving "that it is a tough and invincible power."

Iran has refused to back down on its demands that the US end its blockade of Iranian ports and fulfill other conditions before Tehran will consider reopening the Strait of Hormuz.

The closure of the key waterway — through which roughly one-fifth of the world's traded oil supplies passed before the war — has kept energy prices a major focus of US politics ahead of November's midterm elections. Araghchi said on his Telegram channel that in a

call with German Foreign Minister Johann Wadepuhl late Monday, he had "emphasised that making the Strait of Hormuz secure requires an end to the United States' aggressive actions and unlawful interventions, including the naval blockade and other violations of US obligations."

Wadepuhl said on X that he had emphasised "the Strait of Hormuz needs to be opened unconditionally ensuring free and safe navigation for all." Trump said, directing his negotiators to include "compensation from Iran, for all of the people that they have killed and gravely wounded with their roadside bombs and many conflicts." That was after Iran demanded compensation for the devastation caused to the country by the US and Israeli bombardment over the past five months.

PML-N likely to form Govt in PoK

Two former so-called prime ministers suffered defeats in their strongholds in the third phase of elections in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), according to unofficial results released on Tuesday.

Pakistan People's Party's Faisal Mumtaz Rathore, who is currently serving as the region's premier, managed to retain his seat in the polls, marred by violence and allegations of rigging.

According to the unofficial results, PPP bagged two seats while Pakistan Muslim League Nawaz (PMLN) and Awami Dast-o-Bazu Party, backed by both Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI) and Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), won one seat each.

The third phase of voting, which concluded on Monday, was held in four out of 11 constituencies. The voting on the remaining seven seats was postponed "due to concerns over the law-and-order situation".

The first and second phases of the polls in the region's so-called legislative assembly were held on July 27 and August 2, and were marred by violent protests and massive rigging allegations.

The region's election commission has said that the voting for the remaining seats is likely to be held on August 21. India maintains that the entire Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh are integral and inalienable parts of it. New Delhi also asserts that Pakistan has been in "illegal and forcible occupation" of parts of these Union Territories.

Ex-Syrian President Assad sentenced to death in absentia for war crimes

A Syrian court sentenced ousted Syrian President Bashar Assad along with his younger brother to death in absentia on Tuesday for crimes against humanity and war crimes during Syria's 14-year conflict that left about half a million people dead.

The sentences at the Fourth Criminal Court in Damascus are the first against Assad or members of his inner circle since the Assad family's five decades in power came to an end 20 months ago.

"Bashar Assad used State agencies to commit war crimes and crimes against humanity," said judge Fakhreddine al-Aryan during a court session that was aired live on state TV.

Also sentenced to death was Assad's maternal cousin Atef Najib, who was convicted of overseeing a crackdown in the southern province of Daraa that led to the uprising and later the civil war. Al-Aryan said Najib can appeal.

Under tight security, Najib stood inside a cage wearing a prisoner's uniform as the judge read the sentence. A crowd gathered outside the courthouse in central Damascus to hear the verdict.

"Today is the day of justice for all the wounded, martyrs, detainees and Syrians who were forced to leave their country," said attorney Adnan al-Masalmeh who represented families of Najib's victims.

"Today marks a victory of right against injustice, a victory of the Syrian people against the ousted regime," Assad and his brother Maher fled to



Russia after the Government's fall in December 2024 and received political asylum. Syria's new rulers have asked Russia to hand the Assads over.

Najib, who was sanctioned by the US Department of the Treasury in April 2011, was later detained and is one of the highest-ranking security officials to be put on trial.

Najib is a former army brigadier general who was head of the Political Security Branch in Syria's southern Daraa province under Assad in 2011. During his tenure, more than a dozen teenagers who scrawled anti-Government graffiti on a school wall in Daraa were arrested and tortured. The case became a catalyst for mass protests against the repressive policies of Assad's security forces.

The protests were met by a brutal Government crackdown that spiraled into a 14-year civil war that ended with Assad's ouster in a lightning rebel offensive. Some of Najib's victims were present at the courthouse including two who were teenagers in 2011 and expressed their opinions to The Associated Press.

Russian strikes kill 10 in Ukraine

Russia attacked Ukrainian cities with missiles, drones and glide bombs on Tuesday, killing at least 10 civilians, officials said, as President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Moscow is getting new military help from North Korea for its more than 4-year-old invasion.

Zelenskyy said Russian forces used ballistic missiles supplied by North Korea in an overnight attack on the southeastern city of Zaporizhzhia, where officials said seven people were killed and 24 wounded. Three more people, including a 15-year-old boy, were killed by Russian drones and artillery in the central Dnipropetrovsk region, authorities said.

In addition to the ballistic missiles, North Korea is preparing to deploy more of its troops to Russia, Zelenskyy said. Russian President Vladimir Putin and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un signed a strategic partnership agreement in 2024, pledging mutual aid if either country faces aggression. Kim has sent



thousands of troops and huge supplies of weapons to support Putin's full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

Ukraine says Russia is scaling up its production of ballistic missiles, aiming to exploit Kyiv's critical shortage of Patriot air defense interceptors that can stop them, and claims Moscow is preparing to recruit more troops for a new push on the front line that stretches 1,250 kilometers (775 miles) along eastern and southern Ukraine. "Every step Russia takes — increasing ballistic missile production, bringing in North Korean equipment, preparing for mobilisation — all of this shows that Moscow is preparing not for peace, but for escalation," Zelenskyy said on social media.
