Flowers were also showered from a helicopter on Shiva devotees all along the Kanwar route which reverberated with the chants of 'Har-Har, Bam-Bam'.

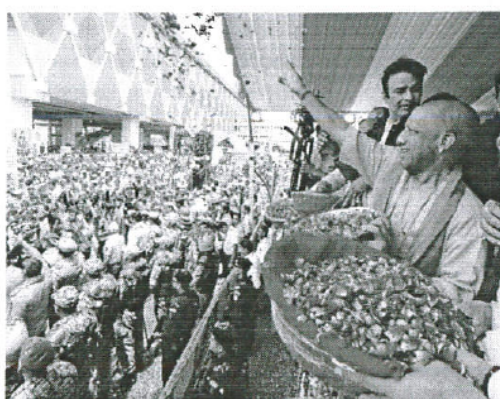
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public representatives showered rose petals on Shiva devotees, honouring their faith.

Maya slams SP's 'deceptive politics'

Bahujan Samaj Party chief Mayawati on Saturday accused the Samajwadi Party of practising "narrow caste-based politics" and changing its political narrative for electoral gains.

In a statement posted on X, Mayawati said the BSP follows the principle of 'Sarva Jan Hitay, Sarva Jan Sukhay' (welfare and happiness of all) and described it as an Ambedkarite party working for the interests of all sections of society.

She added that the BSP governments in Uttar Pradesh had also been run on the same principle.

Targeting the SP's PDA formula — generally



described as Pichda (backward), Dalit and Apankhyak (minorities) — Mayawati alleged that the party had now changed the meaning of the first 'P' to 'pandit' after noticing growing support for

the BSP among upper-caste communities, particularly Brahmins. She termed the alleged change another example of what she described as the SP's "political deception and opportunism."

Mayawati further argued that politics based on such "deception" might provide temporary benefits to an individual or a particular section, but could not bring lasting welfare to an entire community.

Appealing to people across social groups, the BSP chief urged voters to remain cautious of what she called the SP's "deceptive politics" and narrow caste-based approach, saying that doing so was in the larger interest of society.

AKY pretending to be well-wisher of Brahmins: Pathak

Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Brajesh Pathak on Saturday slammed Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav for "pretending to be a well-wisher"



of the Brahmin community and said ideas should be couched with ideas, not with "bitterness and baseless accusations". "Today, you are pretending to be a well-wisher of the Brahmin community, but the words that came from your mouth —

asking a journalist his caste and saying, 'Mishra ji, have some shame' — still pierce the heart of the community like a spear," Pathak said in a post on X. He was referring to an earlier interaction between Akhilesh Yadav and a reporter, a video of which circulated widely online.

The deputy chief minister's remarks come days after SP chief Akhilesh Yadav reached out to the Brahmin community, asserting that "PDA" includes Pandits, and also accused the Bharatiya Janata Party government of targeting opposition workers, Brahmins, and religious leaders, including Shankaracharya.

Addressing a Brahmin Sammelan organised at the SP office here on the birth

anniversary of late socialist leader Janeshwar Mishra on Wednesday, Akhilesh Yadav alleged that the state government denied permission to hold the event at its proposed venue, Janeshwar Mishra Park in Gomti Nagar, which forced the party to hold it at their office premises instead.

Pathak hit back at the SP leader, targeting him over "dynastic politics". "Dr Ram Manohar Lohia was one of the staunchest opponents of dynastic politics. He used to say that one who clings to the family becomes alienated from society. He also believed that when the family becomes the most powerful entity, society weakens," Pathak remarked in Hindi. "Those who engage in

politics in Lohia's name today are the very ones who have abandoned his ideals. Had Lohia been alive today, he would have been the first to rigorously question those who make dynastic politics the basis of their political activity. He would never have accepted a brand of politics aimed at securing power for one's family," Pathak said.

The BJP leader added that the uplift of society is not achieved by bringing one family to power, but by ensuring equal opportunities, justice, and respect for every section of society.

"As far as my public life is concerned, it is the public that evaluates it. I have always accorded the highest priority to the organisation,

the Constitution, and public service. Personal allegations, abusive language, and malicious propaganda can neither alter the truth nor the public's trust," he said.

Pathak also said that the politics of the BJP was based on the principles of "Nation First, Organisation Foremost, and Antodaya" (uplift of the last person), whereas the fundamental objective of dynastic politics was to confine power to a single family. "The public fully understands this distinction. Antodaya (uplift of the last person) are natural in a democracy. However, ideas should be countered with ideas and facts with facts, rather than with confusion, bitterness, and baseless allegations," he said.

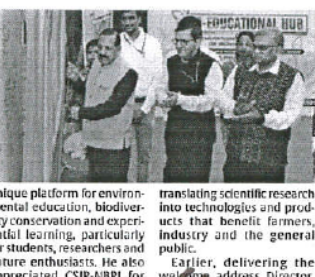
The integrated facility has been developed as a first-of-its-kind eco-educational hub centred aimed at blending sci-

the initiative, saying that the Centre represents a unique blend of science, culture and conservation. He emphasised the need to strengthen inter-institutional collaboration, particularly among institutions under the science and technology ministry, and to organise joint activities and programmes. The minister said that the facility would serve as a

and digital learning platforms. He noted that the project reflects NBRI's commitment to promoting sustainable development while inspiring future generations towards environmental stewardship. TOURIST COUNT CROSSES 1.7 CRORE-MARK

Once largely identified with its Nawabi monuments, chikan kari and Awadhi cuisine, Lucknow is steadily building a wider tourism identity, adding military heritage, experiential museums, nature-based attractions, global gastronomy and MICE tourism to its traditional appeal. The shift is showing in the numbers: tourist arrivals have risen from 40.4 lakh in 2021 to a record 1.71 crore in 2025, making the state capital one of the strongest examples of Uttar Pradesh's expanding tourism canvas.

Tourism and Culture Minister Jaiver Singh said the most visible measure of Lucknow's changing tourism profile is the sustained rise in visitor numbers. Tourist arrivals increased from 40.4 lakh in 2021 to 57.65 lakh in 2022, including around 3,400 foreign visitors. The city received 66.74 lakh tourists in 2023, including nearly 5,000 foreigners, before the figure

climbed to 82.74 lakh in 2024, with around 20,000 foreign arrivals. By the end of 2025, the overall footfall had surged to 1.71 crore, including around 38,000 foreign tourists.

"Lucknow's strength is that it has not had to choose between heritage and development. Its monuments, cuisine, crafts and Ganga-Jamuni cultural traditions remain its foundation, while new museums, experiential attractions, nature spaces and MICE facilities, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions or events infrastructure are widening its appeal," Singh said.

"Under Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's vision of 'Vikas ki Awaaz', the state capital is emerging as a showcase of Uttar Pradesh's changing tourism landscape. The consistent rise in tourist footfall shows that this combination is finding resonance with travellers," he added.

Officials state that transformation reflects a larger state strategy under CM Yogi Adityanath to pair heritage conservation with contempo-

rary tourism experiences. New attractions such as Naval Shauha Vatika, Rashtriya Prerna Sthal, Lucknow Museum of Heritage and Art and Dev Van-Nakshatra Vatika have broadened what visitors can experience in the city, while initiatives such as Lucknow Darshan, UP Darshan Park and light-and-sound presentations at historic sites are adding new layers to the capital's tourism offering. Among the most distinctive additions is Naval Shauha Vatika, developed jointly by the Indian Navy and UP Tourism as an open-air museum and interpretation centre. Its centrepiece, the decommissioned INS Gomati, along with naval equipment and exhibits, gives visitors, particularly youngsters, closer look at India's maritime history and the valour and service of naval personnel.

At Rashtriya Prerna Sthal, three 65-ft bronze statues of former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Pandit Deendari Upadhyaya and Dr Syama Prasad Mookerjee form the visual centrepiece.

A modern museum documents their lives, ideas and shared values, while introducing, adding another cultural and educational destination to the city.

"Lucknow's older cultural identity, meanwhile, is being retold through technology. Spread across around 4,973 square metres in Hussainabad, the Lucknow Museum of Heritage and Art uses digital interpretation to present the story of Awadhi. Galleries themed around Moud Daura, Hunar ka Safar, Ganga-Jamuni, Teliazeeb, Karigari, Saamhi Aastha, Nehru-e-Awadh, Nirjya Kala, Natyashala and Zalka-e-Awadh bring together the city's history, crafts, performing arts, shared traditions and culinary culture," said a tourism official.

At the other end of the spectrum is the city's growing MICE tourism profile. Lucknow has hosted major regional, national and international engagements. In recent years, food, film, emerging as another major calling card.

asking a journalist his caste and saying, 'Mishra Ji, have some shame' — still pierce the heart of the community like a spear," Pathak said in a post on X. He was referring to an earlier interaction between Akhilesh Yadav and a reporter, a video of which circulated widely online.

The deputy chief minister's remarks come days after SP chief Akhilesh Yadav reached out to the Brahmin community, asserting that 'PDA' includes Pandits, and also accused the Bharatiya Janata Party government of targeting opposition workers, Brahmins, and religious leaders, including Shankaracharya.

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Pathak hit back at the SP leader, targeting him over "dynastic politics". "Dr Ram Manohar Lohia was one of the staunchest opponents of dynastic politics. He used to say that one who clings to the family becomes alienated from society. He also believed that when the family becomes the most powerful entity, society weakens," Pathak posted in Hindi. "Those who engage in

politics in Lohia's name today are the very ones who have abandoned his ideals. Had Lohia been alive today, he would have been the first to rigorously question those who make dynastic politics the basis of their political activity. He would never have accepted a brand of politics aimed at securing power for one's family," Pathak said.

The BJP leader added that the uplift of society is not achieved by bringing one family to power, but by ensuring equal opportunities, justice, and respect for every section of society.

Lucknow grows from heritage capital to new age tourism hub

TOURIST COUNT CROSSES 1.7 CRORE-MARK

Once largely identified with its Nawabi monuments, chikankari and Awadhi culture, Lucknow is steadily building a wider tourism identity, adding military heritage, experiential museums, nature-based attractions, global gastronomy and MICE tourism to its traditional appeal. The shift is showing in the numbers: tourist arrivals have risen from 40.84 lakh in 2021 to a record 1.71 crore in 2025, making the state capital one of the strongest examples of Uttar Pradesh's expanding tourism canvas.

Tourism and Culture Minister Jaiveer Singh said the most visible measure of Lucknow's changing tourism profile is the sustained rise in visitor numbers. Tourist arrivals increased from 40.84 lakh in 2021 to 57.65 lakh in 2022, including around 3,400 foreign visitors. The city received 66.74 lakh tourists in 2023, including nearly 5,000 foreigners, before the figure

climbed to 82.74 lakh in 2024, with around 20,000 foreign arrivals. By the end of 2025, overall footfall had surged to 1.71 crore, including around 38,000 foreign tourists.

"Lucknow's strength is that it has not had to choose between heritage and development. Its monuments, cuisine, crafts and Ganga-Jamuni cultural traditions remain its foundation, while new museums, experiential attractions, nature spaces and MICE (meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions or events) infrastructure are widening its appeal," Singh said.

"Under Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's vision of 'Vikas Bhi, Virasat Bhi', the state capital is emerging as a showcase of Uttar Pradesh's changing tourism landscape. The consistent rise in tourist footfall shows that this combination is finding resonance with travellers," he added.

Officials state that transformation reflects a larger state strategy under CM Yogi Adityanath to pair heritage conservation with contempo-

rary tourism experiences. New attractions such as Naval Shaurya Vatika, Rashtra Prerna Sthal, Lucknow Museum of Heritage and Art and Dev Van-Nakshatra Vatika have broadened what visitors can experience in the city, while initiatives such as Lucknow Darshan, UP Darshan Park and light-and-sound presentations at historic sites are adding new layers to the capital's tourism offering. Among the most distinctive additions is Naval Shaurya Vatika, developed jointly by the Indian Navy and UP Tourism as an open-air museum and interpretation centre. Its centrepiece, the decommissioned INS Gomati, along with naval equipment and exhibits, gives visitors, particularly youngsters, a closer look at India's maritime history and the valour and service of naval personnel. At Rashtra Prerna Sthal, three 65-ft bronze statues of former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya and Dr Syama Prasad Mookerjee form the visual centrepiece.

A modern museum documents their lives, ideas and contribution to nation-building, adding another cultural and educational destination to the city.

"Lucknow's older cultural identity, meanwhile, is being retold through technology. Spread across around 4,973 square metres in Hussainabad, the Lucknow Museum of Heritage and Art uses digital interpretation to present the story of Awadh. Galleries themed around Mool Dhara, Hunar Ka Safar, Ganga-Jamuni Tehzeeb, Karigari, Saanjhi Aastha, Mehfil-e-Awadh, Nritya Kala, Natyashala and Zaika-e-Awadh bring together the city's history, crafts, performing arts, shared traditions and culinary culture," said a tourism official.

At the other end of the spectrum is the city's growing MICE tourism profile. Lucknow has hosted major regional, national and international engagements in recent years. Food has emerged as another major calling card.

एलकेजी छात्र को टीचर ने डंडे से पीटा

KANPUR (8 Aug): नौबस्ता के यशोदानगर स्थित निजी स्कूल में एलकेजी के साढ़े पांच वर्षीय छात्र को शिक्षिका पर डंडे से पिटाई करने का आरोप लगा है. शुक्रवार को स्कूल से घर पहुंचने पर बच्चे की पीठ पर चोट के निशान और सूजन देख स्वजन के होश उड़ गए. बच्चा डरा-सहमा था. स्वजन ने चाइल्ड हेलपलाइन पर शिकायत करने के साथ ही शनिवार को स्कूल पहुंचकर विरोध जताया. कई घंटे की बातचीत के बाद शिक्षिका को हटाने के आश्वासन और लिखित माफीनामे पर मामला शांत हुआ. फिलहाल पुलिस में शिकायत नहीं की गई है.

खादी, काकोरी व क्रांति का कानपुर कनेक्शन

आजादी के इतिहास में कानपुर के लिए बेहद अहम है आज की तारीख

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KANPUR (8 Aug): देश की आजादी की लड़ाई में कानपुर और यहां के लोगों की अहम भूमिका रही है. 9 अगस्त भी शहर के स्वतंत्रता आंदोलन के इतिहास की खास तारीख है. इस दिन से जुड़ी तीन बड़ी घटनाएं कानपुर के इतिहास में दर्ज हैं. 9 अगस्त 1921 को महात्मा गांधी कानपुर पहुंचे और मारवाड़ी विद्यालय में खादी व स्वदेशी का संदेश दिया. 9 अगस्त 1925 के काकोरी ट्रेन एक्शन के तार भी कानपुर से जुड़े रहे. इस मामले में शहर के राजकुमार सिन्हा, सुरेशचंद्र भट्टाचार्य और रामदुलारे त्रिवेदी को सजा हुई. वहीं, 9 अगस्त 1942 को अंग्रेज सरकार ने कांग्रेस को असंवैधानिक संस्था घोषित कर दिया. इसके बाद कानपुर में कांग्रेस के मुख्यालय तिलक हॉल, मेस्टन रोड पर सरकारी ताला लगा दिया गया.

काकोरी के तार कानपुर से जुड़े

9 अगस्त 1925 को हिंदुस्तान रिपब्लिकन एसोसिएशन (एचआरए) के क्रांतिकारियों ने काकोरी ट्रेन एक्शन को अंजाम दिया था. सरकारी खजाना लूटकर उससे क्रांतिकारी गतिविधियों के लिए हथियार खरीदना इसका मकसद था. रामप्रसाद बिस्मिल, अशफाक उल्ला खां और चंद्रशेखर आजाद समेत कई क्रांतिकारी इसमें शामिल थे. इतिहासकार अनूप कुमार शुक्ल के अनुसार, काकोरी केस में कानपुर से जुड़े राजकुमार सिन्हा, सुरेशचंद्र भट्टाचार्य और रामदुलारे त्रिवेदी को भी सजा हुई थी.

स्वदेशी के बिना स्वराज नहीं

कानपुर इतिहास समिति के महासचिव अनूप कुमार शुक्ल के अनुसार, महात्मा गांधी 9 अगस्त 1921 को कानपुर पहुंचे थे. कानपुर के नागरिकों के अभिनंदन पत्र के जवाब में गांधी जी ने कहा था कि स्वदेशी के बिना स्वराज नहीं मिल सकता. उन्होंने महिलाओं से खादी पहनने और वस्त्रा चलाने की अपील की. कहा था, हम लोगों को यह सीखना है कि मरना किस तरह चाहिए. गांधी जी ने लोगों को स्वावलंबी बनने का संदेश दिया था.

भारत छोड़ो आंदोलन के दौरान 9 अगस्त 1942 को अंग्रेज सरकार ने कांग्रेस को असंवैधानिक संस्था घोषित कर दिया. कानपुर में कांग्रेस के मुख्यालय तिलक हॉल पर सरकारी ताला लगा दिया गया. बड़े नेताओं की गिरफ्तारी के बाद कई युवा नेता भूमिगत हो गए और आंदोलन की कमान संभाली. कानपुर में आंदोलन ने उग्र रूप भी लिया. नेताओं की गिरफ्तारी के विरोध में मजदूरों ने हड़ताल की.

सेंट्रल स्टेशन पर बम फट, जबकि मंघना रेलवे स्टेशन और नरोना पोस्ट ऑफिस में आग लगा दी गई. सरकारी कार्यालयों और पुलिस दफ्तारों को भी निशाना बनाया गया और रेलवे पटरियां उखाड़ने की घटनाएं हुई. इस तरह 9 अगस्त कानपुर के स्वतंत्रता आंदोलन में तीन अहम पड़ावों का गवाह बना- गांधी का स्वदेशी संदेश, काकोरी क्रांतिकारियों की भूमिका और अगस्त क्रांति का उभार.
